In carrying on the work for the past three or four years there has been an accumulating deficit and the Directors must provide a larger budget this year owing to a sixteen months term, due to a change in the ending of the financial year from December to April.

The appeal is for \$6,000 and a hearty and gratifying response is looked for by the Campaign Committee.
