BOSTON (AP)—Chicago White Sox moved back into first place in the American League pennant race by edging Boston Red Sox 2-1 Tuesday night on a two-run homer by big Walt Drogo and six-hit pitching by veteran Bob Keegan.

The triumph, coupled with New York's 11-2 loss to Cleveland, game lead over the Yankees.

Dark Horse Argentinian Wins Atlantic City Swim

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (CP)—A swimming gauchito from the Argentine won the 25-mile Atlantic City marathon swim Tuesday night, staggering in through the breakers after a terrific finish as darkness fell.

Alfredo Camarero, 26, of Buenos Aires, became the hero of the annual water battle—the toughest in its four-year history—by defeating Tom Park, twice winner of the event, by a comfortable margin.

Camarero's time for the race for a routine examination and passed in perfect form.

Among Canadians who quit were Doreen George, Toronto; Lise Jannicky, Montreal first woman to finish in 1955, and Aloha Keen, Montreal.

For Camarero the win avenged a defeat last month by Park in a 38-mile swim in Mexico. Park finished about two hours ahead of Camarero who placed third in that race. Miss Andersen was second.

EARLY LEAD Park took an early lead Tuesday but was passed by Camarero near the five-mile point. Park surged into the lead again near 10 miles out but Camarero swished by when Park stopped in the water for refreshment.

The Argentinian held the lead for several miles but Park, seeming to get his second wind, surged back in the lead about three miles from the finish and at one time held advantage of more than 200 yards.

But a strong finish by Camarero overcame this advantage and he beat Park to the finish line by about 200 yards.

The weather was sunny and warm during the day and anticipated thundershowers failed to develop.

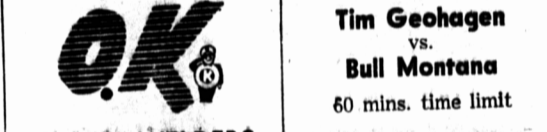

In the women's singles, top-seeded Althea Gibson of New York had to struggle to gain a second-round 6-4, 6-4 win over Suzi Koermeoczy of Hungary.
