OTAWA (CP)—China will probably make a nuclear test in the near future, according to a report from the United States, said a spokesman here today.

The nuclear test will spread contamination far and wide at a time when a test ban treaty supported by Canada and more than 100 other countries—

resulting from earlier atmospheric tests by the United States, Russia, and other countries, have been reduced.
