The game, one of the best seen in Summerside this season, was a bitter pitchers battle between Ed Buckley and Benny Carson for seven scoreless innings. In the top of the eighth Abbie Juniors pushed across what looked like a very important run. Howd walked. MacFadyen pushed a squeeze bunt towards Buckley and Howd was called safe on a very close force play at the plate. Grady crossing the plate, Carson seemed to have taken Kennedy's throw in time to get to the base, but failed to make the tag. Walker's single to centre then scored Buckley. The Abbies roared right back into contention in the top of the ninth with three clean base hits, which with an error by shortstop Grady accounted for two runs. There were two on base and two out when MacFadyen's grounder to Cannon ended the game and the series. Realy and Don MacLeod both had two hits for Abbies and Neil Walker had a brace of bingles for

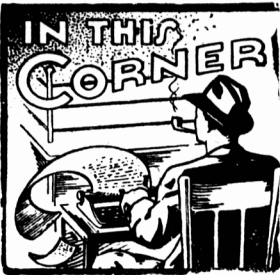
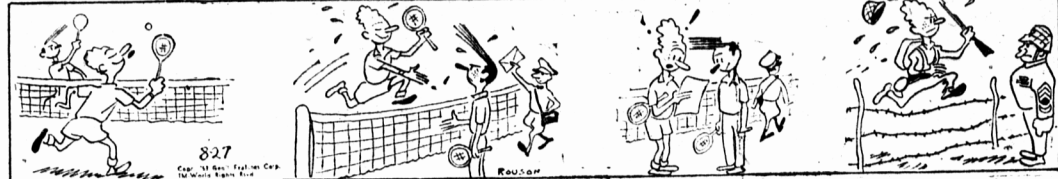

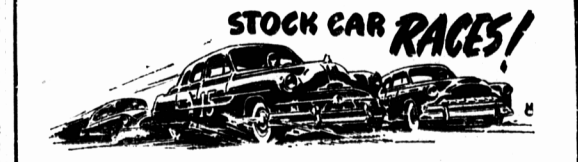

Mrs. Cannon was runner-up with a two day score of 205. She fired a 111 yesterday after covering the Belvedere Course with a brilliant 94 last Saturday.
