Accidents Cause \$1,000 Damages

City police have had a very busy weekend with investigations into six separate accidents causing over \$1,000 worth of damage to automobiles and property involved.

Five of the accidents occurred Friday while the other occurred at 12:35 p.m. Saturday.

In this accident, which occurred at the intersection of Passmore and Elm Avenue, the driver of a 1958 Chevrolet, Frank Clow of Strazens was forced to apply the brakes of his vehicle quickly. The result was that he was struck from behind by a 1950 Oldsmobile, driven by Howard Douglas, Elm Avenue.

The first accident on Friday took place at about 8 a.m. when a 1952 Plymouth, driven by David Ramsay, West Royalty, in attempting to avoid a collision with a 1956 Meteor, operated by Peter F. McMurrer, Charlottetown, swerved and struck a light pole at the intersection of Elm Avenue and Allen Street.

At 2:45 p.m. Friday, a second collision occurred when a 1952 Chevrolet, driven by Pierce Trowbridge, Mt. Albert, moving west on Dorchester Street, collided with a 1959 Simca travelling north on Weymouth Street, driven by Ralph Kneebone, Charlottetown.

Ch'town Curling Club Notes Upswing in Interest Needed

A second curling club in the city of Charlottetown will have a definite effect on the membership of the existing club, a spokesman for the Charlottetown Curling Club said Saturday.

Plans are moving ahead at the Charlottetown Golf Club for the construction of a curling rink. If the plans are carried through, the new setup will include a new clubhouse and a four lane curling rink.

The Charlottetown Curling Club spokesman said that, at present, his club generally accepted most new applications for membership to fill gaps left by an average annual turnover of 50-60 members, but no membership drive has ever been necessary.

A new club would definitely cut into the membership of the existing club, however, attention would have to be focused on creating more interest in curling to bring membership to capacity in two clubs.

The spokesman said the new club would probably have a harder job filling its membership quota than would the existing club, because of the great number of long standing members at the Charlottetown Curling Club.

He said, however, combined golf and curling clubs are proving extremely popular in other parts of Canada. The promotion of curling interest would hold the key to increased membership, however, it was noted.

Ferry Traffic Figures Show Big Increase

An increase of 1,228 passengers ferried by the Northumberland Ferries Limited during the month of June compared with last year is evident in traffic figures recently released.

During the 1961 period a total of 14,525 passengers were carried while during June 1962, 15,753 passengers were ferried. An increase in automobiles and trucks is also noticeable during the month with 4,912 cars being ferried in 1961 compared with 5,407 in 1962, an increase of 495.

A total of 1,168 trucks were carried during June of 1961 compared with 1,456 this year, an increase of 288.
