HOW MUCH PER COW

Farm costs may be divided into two main divisions, money spent for running expenses, such as wages, gasoline, supplies, feed, etc. and capital expenditures for land, buildings, machinery, etc. It logically follows that there should be some reasonable proportion between the income and the capital investment.

In other words, if the farm only yields a small amount in the way of cash returns than it is had business to have a great deal of money invested in fixed assets.

The recent survey of dairy herds in Ontario suggests that dairy farmers should confine their investment in barns within certain limits. In the case of those in the fluid milk trade an investment in the barn of \$400.00 per cow can be justified but when shipping milk to other markets the investment should be approximately \$250.00.

Since the Nuffield Foundation Scholarships were first offered in Canada five years ago, two young island farmers William Cairns and Archie Johnstone have been recognized and have found the experience in the Old World both interesting and valuable.

FARM FORUM PREPARATIONS

Monday, October 31st will set the stage for the first Farm Forum meeting of the coming season. The discussion topic "Teacher or Sitter" is one designed to direct attention to the problem of providing the rural community with an adequate supply of suitable teachers.

LIGHT LAMBS

At the present time the Experimental Farm at Nappan is conducting an experiment in the feeding and finishing of light lambs. These lambs ranging in weights from 60 to 40 pounds live were selected from shipments made through

Maritime Cooperative Services Limited at Moncton and the shippers were reimbursed on the basis of off-car weights and presented grades. The objective of the experiment is to determine the response of the lambs to feeding and the cost of putting on the extra weight and finish.

OCTOBER WELL-BEHAVED

Since the first of October the weather man has smiled on the Province and out of the first nineteen days provided fifteen fine ones—a rainy one and three of an indefinite nature. There has been no serious storms and very little frost in fact, we note one cornfield in a favored location which has not so far been frosted. Even the dahlias in good locations are still in full bloom. On the part of potato growers there can be little cause for complaint on the score of harvesting conditions. There is a great difference between digging potatoes in fine weather and in that of the cold wet variety.

HOG PRICES AND QUALITY

Hog prices in U.S.A. have declined something like 30 percent since the first of 1955 and the market is now close to \$16.50 per cwt. live weight, or \$20.52 per cwt. dressed. At the moment there is no Federal hog support program in U.S.A., but reports are that Secretary Bennett is planning on consultation with producer groups and meat trade groups with a view towards setting up a support programme.



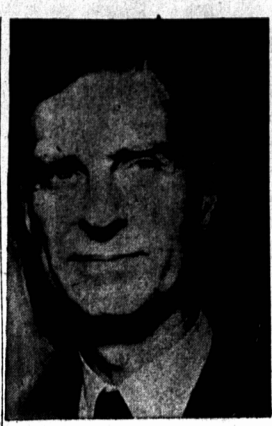

Honoured At Queen's University Convocation

KINGSTON, Ont., Canada — A Scotsman, an American and a Canadian were honored when in solemn convocation they were presented with honorary doctor of law degrees by the old Presbyterian college of Queen's University.

They were John Norman Stuart Buchanan Baron Tweedsmuir, son of a former governor-general of Canada, Lord Tweedsmuir, A.D.I.A.I. Stevenson, democratic nominee in the 1952 presidential election in the United States and Dr. W. P. Thompson, president of the University of Saskatchewan.

BUCHAN PAPERS INCLUDED

Principals in a ceremony in which 4,000 volumes and the private papers of John Buchanan—first Lord Tweedsmuir and Governor-General of Canada from 1935-1940—presented to the University were the donor, Col. R.S. McLaughlin, Oshawa, Ont., and Mrs. McLaughlin, Lord Tweedsmuir, Rector of Queen's Dr. W. A. MacIntosh, author, whose interest in and knowledge of our northern frontiers is equalled by few Canadians, under whose command the Hastings and Prince Edward Regiment achieved great distinction in Italy, a former rector of the University of Aberdeen (which has enjoyed over many decades a highly favorable balance of trade with Queen's University).

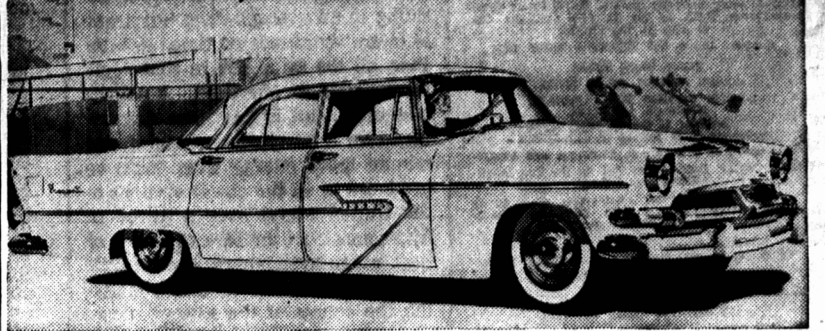
