To Attend Meeting Of TB Ass'n In Vancouver

Garth C. Crockett, B.S.P.H., M.S.P.H., Health Educator for the Provincial Department of Health, has been invited by the Canadian Tuberculosis Association to attend their annual meeting in Vancouver British Columbia late in June, it was announced last night by Dr. M. Lorne Bonnell, Minister of Health.

Dr. Bonnell pointed out that Mr. Crockett has played a very active part in the current island-wide Tuberculin Testing Survey involving the "Heaf" method of tuberculin testing. With the late Dr. P.A. Creelman and Miss Hannah Turner, Public Health Nurse, Mr. Crockett worked out the present method used in the organization and publicity of clinics.

Mr. Crockett's other duties in connection with the Department of Health include giving talks on activities of the Health Department; arrangement of publicity for the various programs undertaken by the different Divisions of the Department; ordering, production and dissemination of health literature; community organization for health purposes; and consultation on educational techniques.

WESTON, Conn. (AP)—Novelist Hamilton Basso gave his wife first aid Sunday when she was bitten on the leg by a copperhead while hiking.

He ran two miles through the woods to reach their home and get a razor blade, then had a neighbor drive him back over a winding forest road.

He cut open the wound and sucked out the poison. She was taken to hospital in Norwalk, where she was reported in fair condition.

Basso is the author of the best-seller, *The View From Pompey's Head*. He said his wife stepped on the snake before she saw it.

Prime Minister St. Laurent and all but two members of his cabinet are seeking re-election. State Secretary Roch Pinard and Mines Minister George Prudham are not candidates.

Completing the cabinet roster, however, are two cent appointees—Paul T. Hellyer, associate defence minister and retiring member for Toronto Davenport, and Lionel Chevrier, president of the privy council, who resigned his Stormont seat in 1954 to head up the St. Lawrence Seaway authority and who now is seeking election in Montreal Laurier, whose former member, J. Eugene LeFrancis, was elevated to the Senate.

HIGHEST MAJORITY

The prime minister is a candidate in Quebec East where his majority of 20,104 votes was the highest in Canada in 1953. Mr. St. Laurent's opponents are Louis Gagnon, Progressive Conservative, and Roland Roy, Social Credit.

John Diefenbaker, PC party leader, is contesting Prince Albert, in Saskatchewan, where nominations were held May 13. He will be opposed by R. M. Gooding, CCF, and Dr. R. E. Partridge, Liberal.

Another Saskatchewan contestant, is Rosetown-Biggan, is M. J. Coldwell, CCF leader. He has a four-way contest against Alex Macdonald, Liberal, Mrs. Henriette Patmore, Social Credit, and Howard Riddell, Progressive Conservative.

Solon Low, Social Credit chief, also was nominated May 13 in Peace River, Alberta. G. W. Baldwin, Progressive Conservative, C. J. Lampert, CCF, Howard MeRae, Liberal, and Hary Wigiluk, independent, are the other candidates in this five-way race.

NEW MEMBERS

Twenty-seven constituencies will have new members in the next House no matter how the voting goes. In six ridings the member has died but in most cases retirement from politics left the field open to a new member.

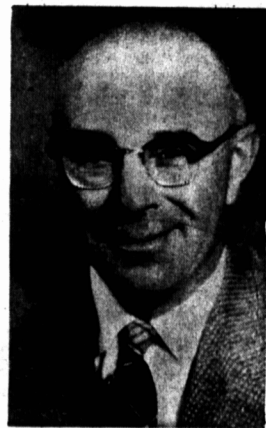
Moose Jaw-Lake Centre in Saskatchewan will elect a successor to Ross Thatcher a candidate in Assiniboia this time. Mr. Thatcher was elected in 1953 as CCF member but later switched to the Liberal party. Hazen Argue, CCF, and W. J. Ferguson, PC, are his opponents in his new riding.

One of the most prominent absentees from this year's contest is George Drew, who led the Progressive Conservative party in two unsuccessful federal campaigns in 1949 and 1953. Mr. Drew, who resigned because of his health, represented Carleton, a Conservative seat since Confederation and once held by Sir John A. Macdonald.

Richard A. Bell, former organizer for the PC party, will try to retain Carleton for the Stewart family. Against him are Stewart Crawford, CCF, Fran Dunlop, Liberal, a former member of the Ottawa Rough Riders Big Four football team, and Eric K. Fallis, Social Credit.
