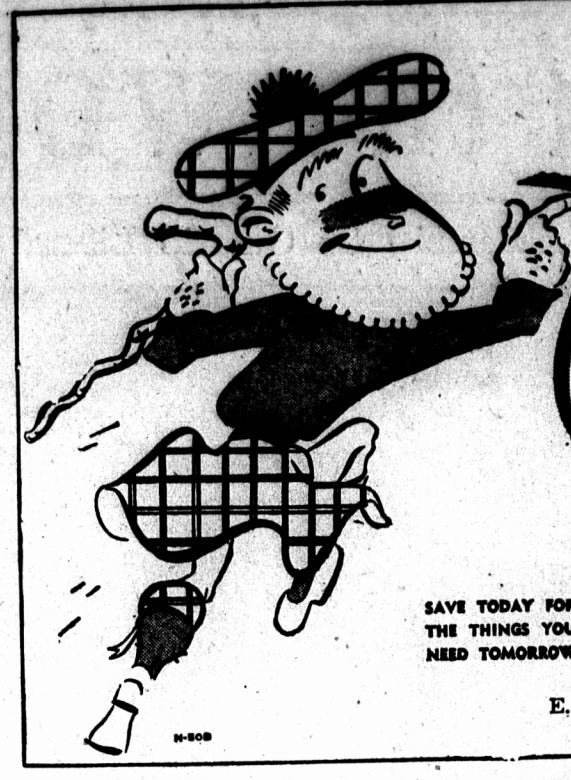

WINNIPEG, Oct. 23 -- (CP) -- Early advances in coarse grains today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange were sharply reduced in the last hour of trade.

Hedging sales and other offerings came into the market in the late stages in response to declines on United States markets. Prices here, however, managed to hold above previous losing levels.

Early in the trade, oats came in for good shipper demand. Buying in barley was less aggressive. Rye was purchased by locals and followed the trend of other grains. Flax was lightly traded.

There were no reports of any export business. Class two wheat and I.W.A. prices dropped one-half cent from Saturday.
