Splendid New Farm Buildings.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

Should the Washington Treaty be Renewed?

Sir, - In a former letter I stated that I believed, unless better terms could be secured, a renewal of the fishery clauses of the Washington Treaty would result in anything but a blessing to Prince Edward Island. Under the present arrangement, it is true, we have the privilege of sending our fish and fish oil into the United States free of duty...

I am aware that the Americans, as a general rule, profess to believe that Canada, under the Treaty, has decidedly the best of the bargain. During the late Presidential election campaign, stump orators, both Republican and Democratic, were frequently heard declaiming against the injustice of allowing Canadian fish to come into their country without being subject to duty...

Some idea of our fisheries, as a source of wealth to the Americans, may be formed by referring to the following statement, showing the quantity of mackerel shipped by American captains, by train, from Souris to Gloucester, Mass., from the 22nd of September to the 6th of October of the present year:

These figures, it is true, give but a very faint idea of the entire quantity of mackerel caught by the Americans last season on our Island coast. Other ports besides Souris, such as Fighish, Summerside, Georgetown, Hawkesbury, &c., can probably also show large shipments of mackerel to the United States by fishermen of that country during the past summer...

In view of this fact, then, what should we receive from them, by way of compensation, if the treaty is to be renewed? I answer again, the free admission into the United States markets not only of our fish and fish oil, but also of our potatoes, oats, and all other kind of farm produce. Nothing short of this will serve as an offset to the wholesale slaughter of our fish, which has been going on for the last few years...
