

A HANDSOME SOUVENIR

The magnanimous treatment that was extended by the Grand Trunk to the delegates to the Fifth Congress of the Chambers of Commerce of the Empire, during their visit to Canada last August, has still further been accentuated by the forwarding to the delegates throughout the British Empire, to their home addresses, one of the most beautiful souvenirs that has ever been issued by any railway. The souvenir is in the shape of a book, and includes a series of reproductions from direct photographs taken during the trip through Ontario and Quebec. The reproductions are in half-tone, printed in the duocolor process, on the finest enamel coated paper that could be secured, the descriptive matter being simply the titles of views, and each page is embellished with a vignette symbolical of each individual district and appearing in the bottom left-hand corner. There are twenty-four pictures in all in the book which, in addition to a view of the splendid train that was tendered by the Grand Trunk to the delegates, shows scenes along the line between Montreal and Niagara Falls, Niagara Falls and Windsor, Sarnia to Muskoka, some beautiful reproductions of the scenes in the "Highlands of Ontario", and a very comprehensive set of group pictures that were taken of the party during their trip. The whole is bound in dark green silk, with a beautiful title page stamped in red and gold showing the coat-of-arms of the Dominion of Canada, encircled with a band of green silk ribbon tied in a bow at the edges. This souvenir will be greatly appreciated by the delegates, and will not only bring back pleasant remembrances of their trip to Canada, but will be an additional factor in bringing before the British Empire the great resources and the magnificent regions in Canada through which the Grand Trunk passes.

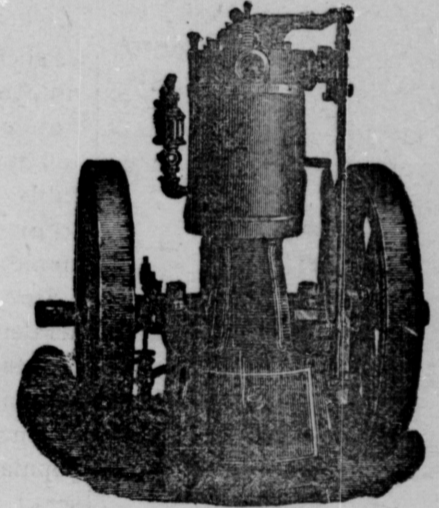
