Mine Victims Still Not Well

SPRINGHILL, N. S. (CP)—The royal commission investigating the Workmen's Compensation Act was told Tuesday eight of the miners who escaped from the mine explosion here last November have not regained their former health and none is receiving compensation.

The eight men appeared with others before Judge A. H. McKinnon and told of their ailments which followed their escape from the explosion - shattered pit in which 39 men died.

Donald Campbell, one of the several survivors receiving compensation, said doctors at first said he was suffering from an emotional disability, but further tests showed his heart was damaged from exertion.

Archie Legree, trapped for four days following the explosion, said "none of the doctors will tell us whether we were affected by gas."

Donald Casey, 51, trapped for 85 hours, said since the explosion he has been short-winded, tired, and has no ambition. Doctors told him in June that something was wrong but he had to receive compensation.

Judge McKinnon told the men that "we'll have to see what can be done." He said the matter will be dealt with separately.

Election Date Prediction Was "Just Off The Cuff"

But the tall, 61-year-old veteran of 21 years in Parliament, now one of Prime Minister Diefenbaker's chief lieutenants, wouldn't be pinned down on just when the next election might be. To an interviewer Tuesday he described as "just an off-hand comment" his recent remark to reporters at Trail, B.C., that a new election would be called "before next July." He said at the time it was just a personal opinion.

Claims Newfoundland Govt. Was Overcharged \$25,000

ST. JOHN'S (CP) — Opposition Leader Malcolm Hollett charged Friday the provincial supply department was overcharged \$25,000 on supplies shipped to Labrador last year and Premier Joseph Smallwood agreed, but not 100 per cent.

Mr. Hollett said in a prepared statement that a firm owned by Bern Hefferton, brother of S. J. Hefferton, then supply minister, sold \$126,714 worth of goods. Mr. Hollett said the store was a retail outlet and it was government practice to buy from wholesalers. He charged that the firm's bill was \$25,000 higher than it should have been.

In another statement Friday night Premier Smallwood said "I do not accept Mr. Hollett's price comparisons, and I certainly do not agree that we were overcharged the \$25,000 that he says we were. I believe the amount is much smaller."

"I deeply regret that this should have happened in the case of a shop owner who has been a life-long Liberal. It would be no better if he had been an opponent of the government, but I regret that it should turn out to be someone who is a supporter of the government. It makes it all the worse."
