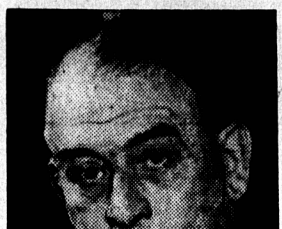

Will Address P.E.I. Red Cross Division



Mr. Paul Vallancourt of Montreal, honorary secretary of the Canadian Red Cross Society, who will address the annual meeting of the Prince Edward Island Division to be held at the Charlottetown Hotel on Monday, February 11th.

Mr. Vallancourt began his Red Cross career with Quebec Division of the Society. In 1929 he was elected Honorary Vice-president and succeeding years Vice-president and President of the Division and a member of the Society's National Executive committee. In 1948 he was elected to the highest active office of the Canadian Red Cross Society—that of Chairman of Central Council—the first French-speaking Canadian to hold this office.

Since the conclusion of his term as Chairman, he has continued to serve the national organization as Honorary Secretary. Late in 1951 he was appointed a Chevalier of the Legion of Honor of France for his "outstanding work" in the world of Red Cross.

Mr. Vallancourt is now Vice-President of the firm Vallancourt Ltee. Montreal. He is Vice-President of the Canadian Club, President of Les Concerts Symphoniques de Montreal, Treasurer of Ste. James d'Arc Hospital, and a Past President of the French Federated Charities Campaign. During the war he was a member of the regional committee of the Selective Service organization and represented the War Time Prices and Trades Board within the regional committee.

The Vallancourt name is an old one in Canadian history. Of French descent, Mr. Paul Vallancourt is of the eighth generation of Vallancourts in Canada. His father, J.A. Vallancourt of Montreal was for 18 years president of La Banque d'Hotelage (later La Banque Canad. Nat.), and his brother, Emile, is Canadian Ambassador to Peru.
