T. B. AND BANG'S TESTS

The livestock breeders in the province, especially in King's County, will be interested to know that the 6th General Tuberculin Test started on Monday of this week. The success that has been obtained by the conducting of these tests in the eradication of this disease has been outstanding, and we would expect that the usual good results would be obtained this year.

Each year we hear the complaint that it is becoming increasingly difficult to control the stable fly. No doubt a great deal of the trouble is due to the fact that the users put their full reliance in the fly spray of their choice. However, it must be born in mind that any fly spray is only an important part of any programme in the elimination of breeding places for the flies.

In the May issue of Farmer's Magazine a very interesting article on "How to Control Farm Flies" was published. In the article Mr. Honey outlines the most practical way to control these pests. He states that one of the first steps is to clean out the pens and keep them clean, especially during warm weather. Also, to remove any manure piles adjacent to the stable.

According to Stewart Dixon, who does most of the fly control work at the O. A. C., flies develop in ten to fourteen days, so manure must be hauled out at least once a week from the places. He says, "spraying knocks out a lot of flies but if their breeding places are not cleaned up they soon reach numbers where the insecticide won't keep them down. True, heavy and frequent spraying of manure piles helps, but even if you win the battle this way it's pretty costly."

He also says, "Where practicable, from the point of view of cost, screens in pigsties, chicken houses, and especially on milk houses since you can't spray in there, help a great deal. Cleaned areas that are screened probably don't need a spray, a bath will get the flies that get in. When using chemical sprays it's important to keep them away from managers, feed bins, water troughs or cups, or any place where livestock can get at it. Apply a coarse spray at low pressure to walls, ceiling, around windows and doors, fill the spray just starts to run off if you apply too much it will run off taking the coating of spray with it. One gallon should cover about 1,000 square feet. You can use a power sprayer at low pressure or any kind of hand, wheelbarrow or knapsack sprayer. For a spray mixture, mix two pounds of 25 per cent Malathion wettable powder in five gallons of water. Sometimes this wettable powder mixture might be hard to handle in hand sprayers, so if you can get the liquid form of Malathion you'll find it easier to work with. If you have freshly white-

washed the barn you may have to apply more spray or an extra coat because white wash tends to neutralize the Malathion a bit. Diazinone is another food material to use. It is licensed for use by Ottawa only a few months ago. Your local dealers will probably have plenty of it by the time you read this. To make up a Diazinone spray mix three pounds of 25 per cent Diazinone wettable powder in 10 gallons of water and spray as you would with Malathion. It is always wise to read manufacturer's directions carefully before using any of these materials. Where all manure is hauled away regularly every week, it is often possible to keep flies under control by spraying once or twice and then using a bait. You can buy fly bait already prepared in either Malathion or Diazinone form. However, you can save a dollar or two by making your own bait. Here's how -

Take one part by weight of 25 per cent Malathion powder and add to it 24 parts of sugar by weight. Mix thoroughly in a tin put in some kind of dry container and keep in a dry place - otherwise it will be hard to handle. When flies start increasing just sprinkle it on floors, window sills, ledges and so on.

In all cases always read directions and take special care to keep these chemicals away from animals, children, livestock feed and human food products. In addition to controlling flies around the buildings follow through and clean up flies - particularly horn flies on cattle. A chemical called Methoxychlor is best material to use because it gets the horn fly and isn't poisonous to animals or humans. Don't use it for house or stable flies because it won't work. In tests at O. A. C. they kept cattle free of horn flies all summer by spraying them every three weeks starting about the time the animals first went on pasture. Officials at O. A. C. say it's not wise to spray cattle with either DDT or Lindane, particularly milk cows and cattle to be sold as beef. These materials are poisonous to humans and tend to accumulate in certain body tissues. Experiments at O. A. C. with DDT that cows sprayed with DDT that the average person would have to drink a lot of milk to be harmed, it would certainly reduce milk consumption in towns and cities if consumers suspected that milk might contain DDT. Best time to spray cattle is when they are tied up in stanchions or rounded up in a small corral. A power sprayer fitted with a lance and nozzle will do the job. One pound of 50 per cent methoxychlor wettable powder in five gallons of water and wet the animals thoroughly especially over their backs and sides.
