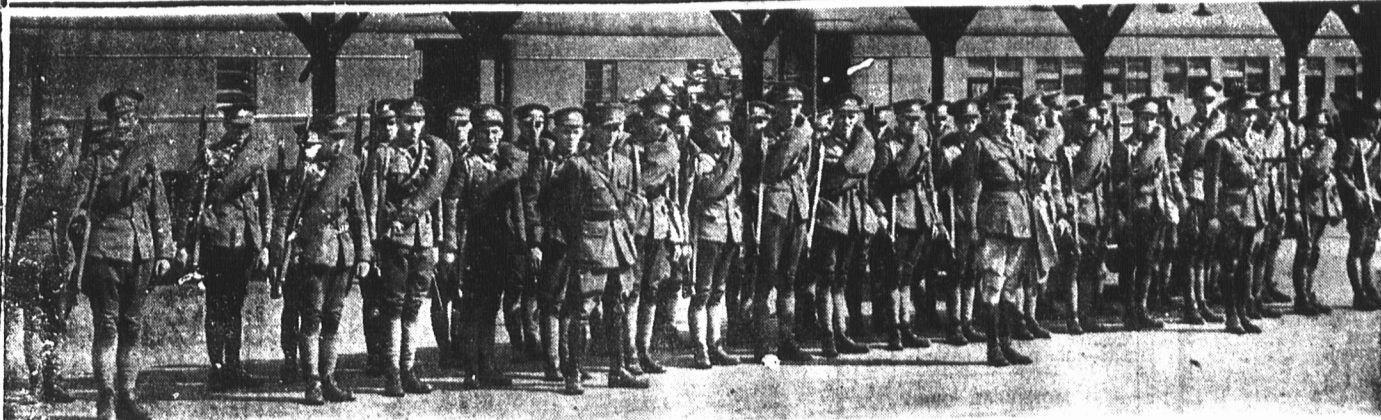


Signallers From Prince Edward Island

LETTROIT, Sept. 19-(AP)—Joe Louis made the eighth defence of his World's Heavyweight Championship here tonight against Bob Pastor in Jiggs Stadium and folks tonight believed the Brown Bomber would run into little or no trouble.

Although Bob made Joe look woefully bad one evening in 1937, going the route in the "Battle of the Biceps," the majority figured the champion would explode his dusky dynamite long before the 20-round limit.

NEW YORK, Sept. 19-(AP)—Though they hit safely in only three innings and got only seven blows in all, the champion Yankees made good use of all their hits today to top Chicago White Sox 6-2 and notch their 100th triumph of the American Baseball League season.

In Washington, the Senators pushed across two runs in the ninth inning to nose out Cleveland 10-9. Playing at Boston, the Red Sox bunched six consecutive singles for a four runs against Bill Trotter in a lucky seventh inning to win 6-2 over St. Louis Browns. Jack Wilson went the distance for the Sox and kept nine hits well scattered to win his ninth victory.

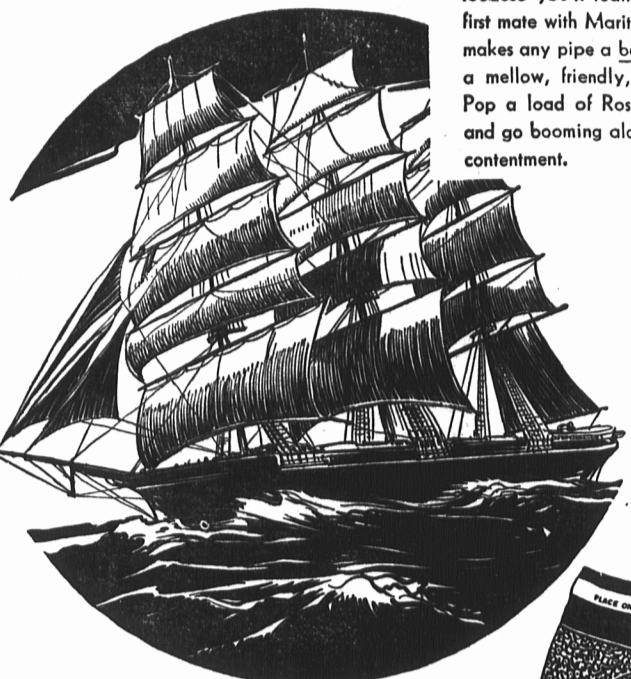

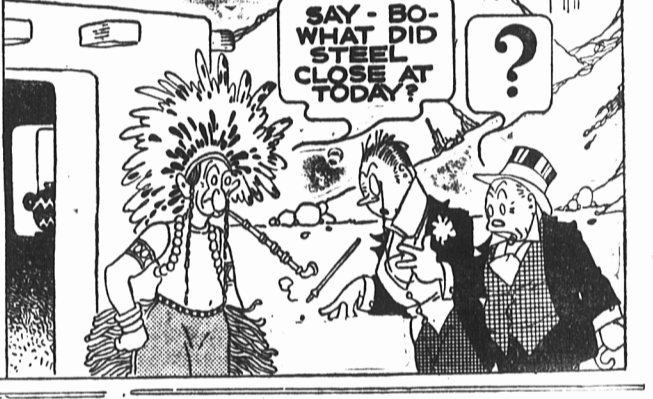
"War Babies" Rocket After Hitler's Speech

NEW YORK, Sept. 19—The stock market's "war babies" were sent soaring once more today after Wall Street traders listened to Fuehrer Hitler's speech at Danzig. Prices of stocks in steel and other industrial groups which traders supposed might benefit from armament and other wartime demands bounded up \$2 to as much as \$5 a share.

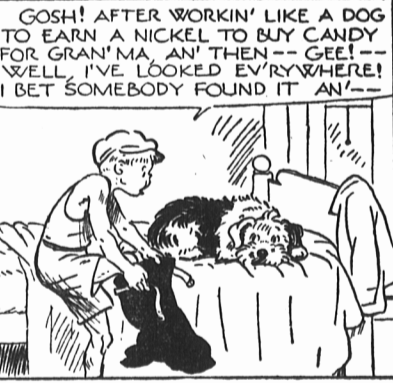
