Laffin added the award to his long list of recognitions including: for both of his two years at UPEI - basketball MVP, conference all-star and second leading scorer, and UPEI outstanding male athlete.

Bradley has lasted through her fourth year of outstanding dedication to our sports program. Tuesday night she was also awarded the MVP, and a recognition of her position on the league all-star team, in field hockey. During all of her four years she also played on the women's basketball team.

Teammates of the athletes of the year also hauled in many awards. In men's basketball, Rookie of the Year was Mark Vickers, Most Improved Player (also all-Canadian Freshman Team

Member) was Tom Kappos, Recipient of a Dedication and Service Award was Mike 'Radar' Roach, and last (maybe least) was Tom Hibbert, winner of the Green Sneaker Award and honorable mention for the H.A. No wonder this was our most successful varsity team.
