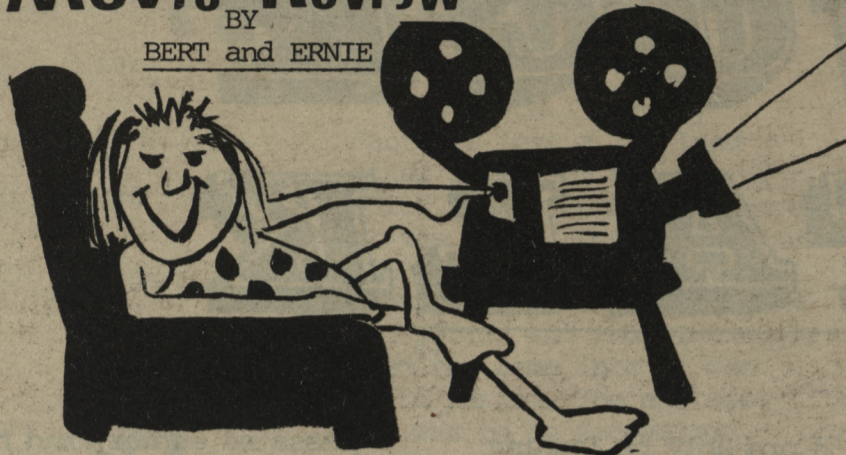


Senior Class News Movie Review

On first review focuses on "Comeback" starring Micheal Landon and is now currently playing up at the Charlottetown Mall. Basically what we have here is a film based on a true story recounting Australian journalist John Everingham's efforts to free his girlfriend from communist ruled Laos.
