

**OBITUARY**

**JOHN L. MACLEOD**  
 The town of Montague was saddened to hear of the sudden passing of a husband, father, brother and friend.  
 The late John L. MacLeod passed away at his home in Montague on May 23rd, 1966 in his 81st year. He was the son of the late Joseph MacLeod. He was born in Caledonia, moved to Iris where he went to school. Later moved to Alliston where he owned a farm.  
 He joined the Army in September, 1929 and served with the Royal Canadian Artillery in the Second World War. He was discharged in 1945.  
 Besides his sorrowing wife, the former Catherine Ethel

MacLeod he leaves to mourn four sons, Lawrence and Johnny at home, Elwood in Alliston, Edward in Camp Gazette, N.B., one daughter Albia predeceased him four years ago, three brothers Stewart, Montague, Stanley and Heatherdale, Earl of Charlottetown and sisters, Lois Buell of Montague, Christie, Mrs. Fred MacRae of Charlottetown, Helen, Mrs. Carl MacKenzie, Vancouver, B.C., Annie, Mrs. Angus Matheson of Montague and his mother Effie MacLeod also three grandsons, George David and Johnny survive him.
