**Carnival Committee Checks Plans For Top Notch Week**

With opening day of Summerside's second annual Lobster Carnival only a few weeks away chairman Edgar Cannon and members of the central committee held a three hour session in the Civic Building Friday evening, finalizing plans for the coming event. Director Charles Hogan reported that a meeting this week the matter of who would cater for the Lobster supper in Civic Stadium for the six days of the carnival was worked out. The ladies of the various service clubs will be on duty during the week of the carnival as follows: Monday, Y's Menettes; Tuesday, R.C.A.F. Association; Wednesday, Kinettes; Thursday, Ladies Auxiliary of the Canadian Legion; Friday Rotary-ans, and on final day the Lionettes. The director also reported that the services of Charles Willis had been obtained to supervise the racing cards for three nights of the Carnival. The committee will also be assisted by Messrs. Willard MacDonald and Andrew Perry

with their wealth of experience in track matters. Letters covering the duties of the service clubs, R.C.A.F. Association, the fireman, and others at the Carnival were passed to the representatives at the meeting and these duties were gone over with the director and finalized. Mr. Buddy Dathe of the Lions Club, who are sponsoring the Soap Box Derby, said that the number of entries received so far for this event, have been disappointing. This year, he said, the new 40 foot ramp to be used in the event is "really something" and he urged the young lads to get their entries in so that the Committee can make the necessary entry groupings in the derby.

The matter of having a special train shuttling back and forth between town and R.C.A.F. Station on Air Force Day, Saturday, July 20, was also discussed. The purpose of the train would be to take some of the car traffic off the highway to the airport. After discussion the matter it was decided against running the train on that day. The opening day program of the Carnival was also gone over by the director at the meeting. The town's second annual event will be officially opened by His Honor Lieutenant Governor T. W. L. Prowse and also in attendance will be the Hon. J. Angus MacLean, M.P. newly-elected Minister of Fisheries, Dr. Orville Phillips, M.P. Group Captain W.H. Sweetman, Commanding Officer R.C.A.F. Station, W-Cdr W.C. Limpert, CADO the presidents of the various clubs, R.C.A.F. Association, Board of Trade, Fire Chief Heath Warren and others. The announcement was also made that this year, a historical display booth, defined as a Miniature museum in itself, will be set up in Civic Stadium to be viewed by the hundreds of tourists and others expected to be in town during Carnival Week, July 15th to 20th.

**Midgets At Summerside**

The wrestling fans of Summerside and vicinity will be privileged to see the best midget wrestlers in the mat game at Civic Stadium on Monday night, Tiny Tim, who hails from Bordeaux, France, is the smallest of all midget wrestlers. But he's big in performance, that boy. He is one of the few wrestlers who can drop kick and land on his own feet. Tim's forefathers were all strong men and weightlifters. Tim didn't inherit their massive forms, but he does have one of the most perfectly proportioned bodies in the athletic world. He and Little Beaver are a very popular tag team. Little Beaver, whose father was the famed Indian hunter Tamgamky, is one of the most agile wrestlers in the game today. His drop and tomahawk blows are very effective. Sky Low Low and Irish Jackie are the meemies among wrestling midgets. Irish Jackie is noted for his unruly and vicious behavior in the ring, and Sky Low Low is not far behind. But they certainly give a watching crowd their money's worth. A large holiday crowd is expected at the Stadium to see the midgets and a pair of the big boys as preliminaries.

**Possession Of Short Lobsters**

A party from Cape Bald, N. B. was fined a total of \$135.00 plus costs for possession of short lobsters when he appeared in county Magistrate's court, Summerside, Thursday before magistrate R.S. Hinton, Q.C. The accused pleaded guilty to three counts of possession of short lobsters at Borden on June 15th, 17, 26. Fisheries officer Norman MacLeod acted for the crown. A party from Indian River charged with robbery with violence had his case further adjourned until July 2nd. A man from Campbellton was fined \$20, and costs for causing a disturbance in a public place by swearing, while a similar fine was levied on a Summerside man for possession of liquor other than in his residence. The case of a party from Fortune Cove charged with unlawfully exposing liquor for sale was adjourned until July 30th, after two crown witnesses gave evidence. The charge resulted from a vanilla extract display in the accused's store which was found to contain 4 1/2 per cent alcohol by volume. An Alberton man charged with possession of liquor and also the sale of intoxicating liquor had his case adjourned until July 30th. A man from Miscouche was fined \$20 and costs, while the case of a Summerside party was adjourned until July 30th after he pleaded not guilty to a charge of possession of a quantity of spirits. (approx. 1 gallon of moonshine). The case of a party charged with operating a vehicle in excess of the gross weight for which the vehicle was registered was adjourned until July 30th.

**Former S'side Man Awarded \$1,000 Science Fellowship**

Donald S. Callbeck, Summerside instructor in chemistry and general science at Spaulding High School, Rochester, N.H. has been awarded a national science foundation \$1000 fellowship to be used for advanced study at the university of New Hampshire this summer. The award, based upon college record, past experience and aptitude, is given by the national science foundation as a means of encouraging men outstanding in the field of chemistry to remain in the teaching profession and to further the education of our youth. Mr. Callbeck who was graduated with a B.S. Degree from Acadia University, Wolfville, N.S. worked at the Canadian Arsenal, Ltd., Montreal, as a chemist-supervisor from 1951 to 1954. After making his decision to enter the teaching profession, he enrolled at Boston University from which institution he received a master of education degree in 1955. Active in education affairs, he is presently serving as first vice-president of the Rochester teachers Association. He has also done considerable work as a member of the professional advancement committee for teachers. Mr. Callbeck is the son of Mr. and Mrs. George A. Callbeck, Summerside.
