Leave it to a UPEI graduate to challenge commonly accepted perceptions about the past on PEI. **Dr. Matthew Hatvany**, a 1989 honours history graduate from UPEI, will be taking a long look at the commonly-held perception that the burden of rent and lease was overwhelming, and placed great hardship on all of the tenantry in Prince Edward Island during the colonial period. Contrary to popular historical versions of that time, Dr. Hatvany will present a very different picture; one where lease or rental arrangements varied significantly according to the individual social and economic circumstances of each tenant family.

Dr. Hatvany, who is currently a post-doctoral fellow in historical geography at Laval University, will present his lecture: "**The Burden of Rent? Myth and Reality**" in the Irving Chemistry Centre Lecture Theatre, on Wednesday, February 19th at 7:30 pm. His presentation is being sponsored during Heritage Week by the History Department and the Institute of Island Studies. A reception and book display will follow and everyone is welcome.
