Montreal: Market continued fractionally higher.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—Despite a scare which upset copper and some sharp trading in air-seals, the stock market moved higher on balance Friday and posted new peaks in the averages. Trading was active.

A generally higher trend was shown by rails, oils, cigarette stocks, electrical equipment, rubbers and farm implements as well as a variety of selected issues.

Anacosta was the most active stock, doing 2 1/2 to 4 1/2 on 181,000 shares. Kennecott was sixth most active, down 3 at 90 1/2 on 57,700 shares.

Taking off from Thursday's record, the Dow Jones industrial average rose 1 1/2 to 1,000. Volume was 3,900,000 shares compared with 2,410,000 Thursday.
