

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

CANADIAN.

WOODSTOCK, N. B., Aug. 14. A collision occurred on the New Brunswick and Canada Railway to-day at Murchie's Mills, near Benton. A car loaded with lumber, on a siding, inadvertently ran out on the main line as the passenger train was coming from McAdam Junction. The latter was coming around a curve at the rate of twenty miles an hour and the danger was not noticed in time to avoid collision. Engineer McFarlane reversed the engine and then jumped clear. The shock of the contact did no bodily injury, but the engine was damaged.

TORONTO, Aug. 15.

The Globe this morning contains the following special cable:

LONDON, Aug. 15.

The object of the mission of Prof. Sheldon to Canada is to make a narrow inspection of the capacities of the country, especially as a field for dairy farming and to report in a work to be published on his return upon the advantages of the Dominion as a field for immigration of English farmers. He will visit Manitoba and the North West first, then the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. He will remain three months in the country. Prof. Sheldon has achieved a great reputation in this country as the writer of a valuable work on dairy farming. He is one of the staff of the Royal Agricultural College at Cirencester and is well known as an agricultural author throughout the kingdom.

EUROPEAN.

The Daily News' St. Petersburg correspondent believes that Ayoub Khan is acting in concert with and has been assisted by the present Ameer.

QUETTA, Aug. 14.

French native reports state that Ayoub Khan still intends to attack Candahar. His hesitation to attack does not arise in a disbelief of his capacity, but because he is uncertain whether to attack by escalade or sap and mine.

PORTSMOUTH, Aug. 15.

A troop ship with 850 men—reinforcements for India, sailed to-day.

SIMLA, Aug. 15.

A despatch from Candahar, August 11th, reports that all is well. The enemy are throwing up siege works around the city, which at present are insignificant. The enemy have many guns, 5,000 infantry and 500 Ghazis.

CORK, Aug. 14.

The seized rifles bear the stamp of 1840. They appear to have been polished up before consignment on the June.

DUBLIN, Aug. 14.

It is remarked that a greater number than usual of sinister looking persons having an American air have been seen about the cities and towns of Ireland, and within the last few days about 400 stand of the best firearms have been purchased here by such persons.

PARIS, Aug. 14.

A correspondent thus summarizes the course matters will take: The Montenegrin question will be settled on the basis of the Count Corti scheme. The value demonstration will be suspended. The Powers will mediate between Turkey and Greece; there will be negotiations regarding Janina which the Turks will not cede at any price, but which the Greeks might safely waive, and Greece will imperatively demand the cession of Metz, with the support of the Powers.

LONDON, Aug. 14.

The Times says: "So hurried have the shipments been made that there are said to be large quantities of American grain here unsorted. The present magnificent weather enhances the value of the home crops and lessens the urgency in the demand for foreign supplies."

UNITED STATES.

NEW YORK, Aug. 15.

A numerous attended meeting of the New York Irish Land League was held this afternoon to consider the resignation of the executive committee. The treasurer's report shows \$1480 had been received for membership, and that disbursements to date left a balance of \$415 on hand. The membership to July 18, as stated by the secretary was 1,562. There was some dissatisfaction expressed at the retirement of the executive committee, and after debate a motion to accept its resignation was adopted. Dr. Wm. B. Wallace was re-elected president; Michael Breslin was chosen vice-president, and James Pallas recording secretary.

CINCINNATI, Aug. 14.

George Rockers, an old man, was killed this morning by Herman Rockers, his son, in Dryton, Ky. Rockers had been melancholy for some time over loss of money of his own deposited with Archbishop Purcell and also of trust funds deposited with the bankrupt St. Francis Church, of Dayton, Ky. He had been drinking and this morning having been refused money by his wife he undertook to strike her with a poker when his son Herman interfered and struck him with a spade crushing in his skull.

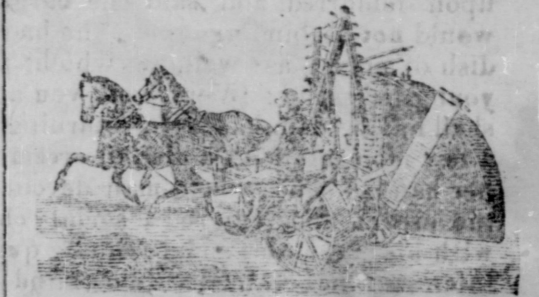
