SLAUGHTERING OF STOCK.—Farmers in the townships of Hungerford and Elizabeth, Ontario, are reporting the slaughtering of stock by thieves who leave the carcasses in the fields and make away with the pelts. Sheep, cows and heifers are the animals killed.

BAD FOR IRELAND.—Reports from various districts in the South of Ireland show that very great damage was done by recent heavy rains in the country of Kerry. The downpour was unprecedented.
