Habs Nip Maple Leafs 3-2 To Grab Two-Game Lead

Canadian Press Staff Writer - TORONTO (CP) - Montreal Canadiens, with Big Berie (Boom Boom) Geoffrion leading the way, exploded for three third-period goals Thursday night to edge Toronto Maple Leafs 3-2 and take a commanding lead in the Stanley Cup final series.

The Habs led the best-of-seven set 3-1.

Geoffrion, making a slow comeback after a painful groin injury late in the season, scored one goal and assisted on the other two as the frontliners overpowered Leafs in the windup period.

All the scoring was wrapped up in the last 20 minutes, with Canadiens getting their three within a space of just more than six minutes after centre Billy Harris sent Leafs ahead 1-0.

Rookies Ab McDonald and Ralph Backstrom scored the other Montreal goals. McDonald got his first of the playoff series at 9:54, six minutes after Harris beat goaltender Jacques Plante on a rebound.

Frank Mahovlich a giant free-wheeling leftwinger, who came on fast in Leafs late season drive, scored Toronto's second goal with just a minute and 24 seconds remaining in the game.

BENCH BOWER Leafs made a desperate bid to pull this one out of the fire by benching netminder Johnny Bower in the last 55 seconds but they couldn't get a strong offensive going. Bower returned to the

net for the final five seconds. Canadiens are favored to capture the cup—their fourth straight—in the fifth game in Montreal Saturday night. If a sixth engagement is needed it will be back here next Tuesday.

Leafs, who won the third game 3-2 in overtime Tuesday, let this game slip through their fingers in the first two periods when they had a big territorial edge in play. But after strong rushes into the Montreal zone they seemed to forget how and where to shoot, making such amateurish plays around Plante that they incurred the vocal wrath of the 13,329 fans.

Time and again Leafs broke across the Montreal blue line only to mess up their strategy by failing to shoot when they had good opportunities.

SHOOTING OFFENDS PUNCH - At one stage of the battle in the second period Leaf coach Punch Imlach was seen waving a reprimanding finger at some of his boys for their horrible shooting.

"If there's a reason for us losing it was our firing," Imlach said in the dressing room.

Harris snapped a 0-0 duel between Plante and Bower at 3:45 of the third period when he tapped Gerry Ehman's 30-foot drive into the net. Leafs seemed to snap out of their mediocrity but Canadiens had other ideas.

Ab McDonald, whirling around 20 feet in front of the goal, slapped a slow roller through Bower's legs on a pass from Backstrom after Geoffrion had carried to the Leaf blue line.
