**Want to go to Peru?**

From May 15-June 30, 30 students and 3 faculty advisors from across Canada will travel to Peru to participate in the 49th annual World University Service of Canada (WUSC) International seminar, and you could very well be one of them. The seminar provides Canadian university students with a first-hand introduction to various aspects of international development.

The seminar begins in May 1996 with an orientation in a Canadian city, then off to Peru where the participants will spend six weeks learning about a new culture and making new friends, while researching individually chosen topics pertaining to development. The working language alternates each year -- this year the working language will be French. It might not hurt if you also know a little Spanish, seeing as the seminar is in Peru.

So, if you can speak French, have a genuine interest in world development, and have a sense of adventure, this seminar is for you. Last year Jolyn Campbell travelled to Vietnam with WUSC, and it was the first time in several years that UPEI was represented. Let's start a tradition and make sure we are represented every year.
