

Teachers' Board Holds Meeting

The Easter meeting of the board of governors of the Prince Edward Island Teachers' Federation held in the Federation house yesterday was chaired by President I.W. Murphy.

In his remarks Mr. Murphy spoke on the successes of the Federation with respect to salary, pension and school programs on television.

Mr. Lidstone, in speaking on behalf of the pension committee, reported changes in the teachers' Superannuation Act. Mabel Matheson also spoke on pensions.

Labor Minister Issues Statement

Hon. Hubert B. McNeill, Minister of Labor, announced yesterday that Municipal Winter Works Incentive Program for the year 1965-66 will be continued on Prince Edward Island until April 30th. Mr. McNeill stated that there were 105 projects approved by the provincial government for the Winter Works Program. 102 of these were approved by the Federal Government and three are still pending.

Mr. McNeill stated that this is the most successful Winter Works Program to date in that the largest number of projects have been approved, the largest amount of wages paid and the largest number of workmen will benefit.

Many capital assets have been made possible to Prince Edward Island due to this Winter Works Program. Among them are: repairs to village halls; a number of ice skating rinks; improvements to fire halls; sidewalks laid in villages; concrete cement tanks for fishermen; shops for fishing boat repairs; fencing around municipal owned lands; a number of senior citizens housing programs throughout the entire Province; sewage work; community parks; sports and recreational centres and a pilot

project on community housing. The Minister stated that he will meet with all communities very shortly to plan for the 1966-67 Winter Works Program to make sure that full benefit will be available to all of the communities. An inventory is being made up from the programs initiated since the start of the Program so that all of the communities may know what their neighbours are doing in this regard.

The Winter Works Program is a joint federal-provincial program with 90 per cent of the labor costs being paid by the provincial and federal government and 10 per cent of the labor cost being borne by the municipalities involved. Period for this year's program is November 1, 1965 to April 30, 1966.

M.V. Abegweit To Drydock

The M.V. Abegweit left for drydock in Halifax shortly after 2 o'clock Tuesday morning for her seasonal refit.

A spokesman for CNR last night said the Abegweit will be out of service for about three weeks or more before the overhaul is completed.

The S.S. Scotian was put into freight along with the S.S. Prince Edward Island. The M.V. Confederation, not equipped with rails, is handling vehicles, reports indicated.

Traffic was termed about average for this time of year although schedules yesterday were a little heavy due to the Easter weekend.
