CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. East-West vulnerable. NORTH: ♠AQTJ, ♥86, ♦A92, ♣K32. WEST: ♠AQ43, ♥865, ♦8875, ♣10875. EAST: ♠KJ10, ♥8753, ♦KJ10, ♣KJ10. SOUTH: ♠KQ10852, ♥KJ10, ♦KJ10, ♣KJ10.

Opening lead—five of clubs. If we look at only the North-South cards, it can be seen that the slam contract is unstable regardless of how the opposite cards are divided, provided—and this is a big proviso—declarer knows where the queen of diamonds is located. In such a case declarer could make four diamond tricks (by means of a finesse or drop), six spades, and two clubs. But in actual life the location of the crucial queen is not known to declarer, and if he chooses his all on a diamond finesse and it turns out he mis-guesses which opponent has the queen, he goes down, since at least one heart-trick would also have to be lost.

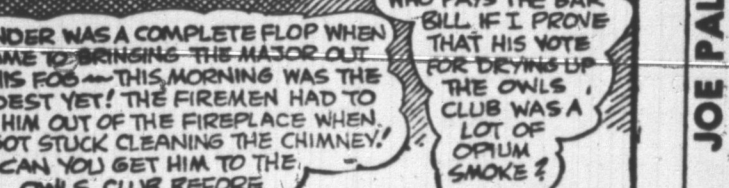
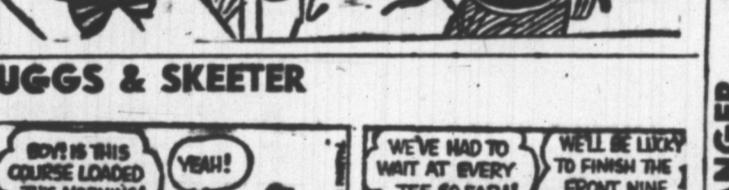
