Mysterious Substance Found In Sclerosis Victims Blood

Our tests have shown that possess an activity that produces the serum of MS (multiple sclerosis) patients does, indeed, of normal persons."

The next job was to identify test in the serum of patients not suffering from MS. In their case its power to break down fat was much less.

Multiple sclerosis is a chronic and progressive condition of the nervous system that often leads to a complete breakdown between parts of the brain and between the brain and parts of the body.

It is usually accompanied by a loss of fatty tissue in nerve sheaths, Dr. Clarke said. The cause was unknown and had at various times been attributed to virus infection, allergy or poisoning by a metal or trace element.

The Toronto scientists investigated a form of related disease that could be induced in animals in laboratory experiments.

Their work suggested that the liquid portion of the blood of these animals possessed the power to break down fat in their brain tissue.

"This could be due to the presence of some substance-antagonistic to fats," Dr. Clarke's summary said, "or even to an increase in the concentration of such substance, over that normally present."

The next step was to look for some similar activity in the blood of human multiple sclerosis patients.
