IN MEMORIAM

JOHN EDWARD MCGAUGHEY
The many friends and acquaintances of Mr. John Edward McGaughey were saddened and shocked to hear of the sudden passing at his home at Green Road on the morning of Dec. 30, 1956.

Although the late Mr. McGaughey had not been enjoying good health for a number of years his death came as a severe shock to his immediate family and friends. His parish priest was hurriedly called for and was soon at his bedside, and so surrounded by good neighbors and those of his immediate family who could be immediately summoned. He passed peacefully away fortified by the rites of the Holy Catholic Church of which he was ever faithful and devoted member.

John Edward was he familiarly known, was born at Green Road and resided here all his life. In 1913 he married Louise Curley of Freetown, who survives him. From this union six children were born who now remain to mourn the loss of a fond and loving father and to comfort their grief stricken mother. The comfort and wellbeing of his wife and his children were ever in his thoughts. He was a devout Catholic and before the chapel was built in his district a few years ago, he often withstood great hardships in order to attend Mass in Kelly's Cross. These journeys he made with faith and humility and seemed to feel that no trial was too difficult and no effort too great when done in the service of his Master.

His funeral which was held from his late residence to St. Joseph's Church, Kelly's Cross, on Jan. 2nd, 1957, was very largely attended. Solemn Requiem High Mass was sung by the pastor, the Rev.
