Livestock

MONTREAL, June 26 (CP)—Receipts on Montreal livestock markets today were 953 cattle, 1,540 calves, 1,733 hogs and 701 sheep and lambs.

Hogs were higher, calves about steady and lambs easier. Cattle prices were not fully established. Early cattle sales were at about steady prices. Good steers made from \$6.75 to \$7.35, mostly \$7 to and medium steers \$6 to \$6.65 and common from \$5.75 down.

Good common from \$5.75 down, medium heifers \$4.75 to \$5.75 with common \$3.50 to \$4.50. A few fed calves made \$7.50 to \$8. Good cows were \$5.25 to \$5.50, medium kinds \$4.25 to \$5 and common \$3.50, medium kinds \$4.25 to \$5 and common \$3.50 to \$4. Bulls ranged from \$3.60 to \$5.50, good bulls selling from \$5 up.

The calf trade was about steady. Medium good to good veals made \$7 to \$7.50 with tops selling up to \$8. Medium kinds were \$6 to \$6.50, mostly \$6.50, and common light veals down to \$5. Drinkers and light grassers were sold in mixed lots at \$4 to \$4.75, mostly \$4 to \$4.50.

Lambs were easier. The bulk of the lambs were sold on a flat basis of \$9 to \$10 according to quality and weight. When graded, good lambs made \$10 to \$10.50, mostly \$10 with culls picked out at \$8. Sheep were \$2.50 to \$3.50.

Hogs were stronger at \$9.75 to \$10 for bacon, fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Feeder hogs were slow and easier at \$9.75 to \$11. Sows were from \$5 to \$6. Hogs sold on ra grade brought \$13.25 to \$13.50 for bacon cold weight.

MONTREAL, June 26 (CP)—Butter prices eased narrowly in almost inactive trading on the Canadian commodity exchange today.

Butter spot: Que. (92 score) 21 1/4-3/8; Que. (38 score) 20-20 3/8.

Cheese spot: Quebec white 12 9-10 1/8; Quebec colored 12 3-4 1/8; Ontario white (June) 12 7-8 1/8; Ontario colored (June) 13-13 1/4.

Eggs spot: A-large 22 1/2-23; A-medium 21 1/2-22; C 15 1/2.

MONTREAL, June 26 (CP)—Feature of trading on open produce markets here today was the rise of nearly two cents which came out in egg prices, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Potato, butter and cheese offerings slipped back slightly.

Creamery butter prices to retailers sold for 22 3/4-23 cents a pound and solids for 22 1/4-2 1/2. Western butter delivered in Montreal was quoted. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale jobbing lots made 21 1/2.

Ontario white cheese sold for 13 1/8 cents a pound and colored for 13 3/8. Quebec white traded for 12 3/4 and colored for 13.

Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 23 cents a dozen for A-large, 20-21 for A-medium, 17 for B-large, and 15 for C.

Potatoes: N. B. and Maine No. 1 mts 80's 1.65-1.85; P. E. I. No. 1 mts 90's 1.85-2.10; Virginia 1.65-1.85.

Currencies

NEW YORK, June 26 (AP)—The British pound swung upward today and away from the \$4.68 mark at which the official committee recently supported the unit in foreign exchange dealings.

The pound gained 3-16 of a cent to \$4.68 3/16. The French franc and Swiss franc showed narrow fluctuations in terms of the dollar while the belga and gulder were unchanged. The Canadian dollar remained unchanged at 1-4 per cent discount.

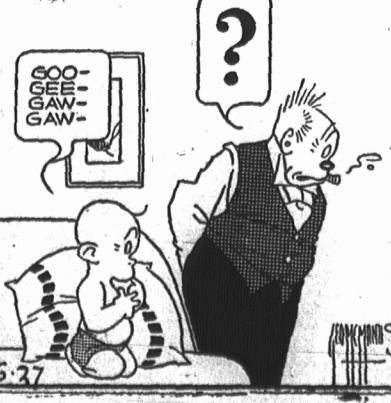
