Gerald-Bernard of Kensington is in charge and will be available to give amateur instruction as to proper stance, holding of the club, and swing.

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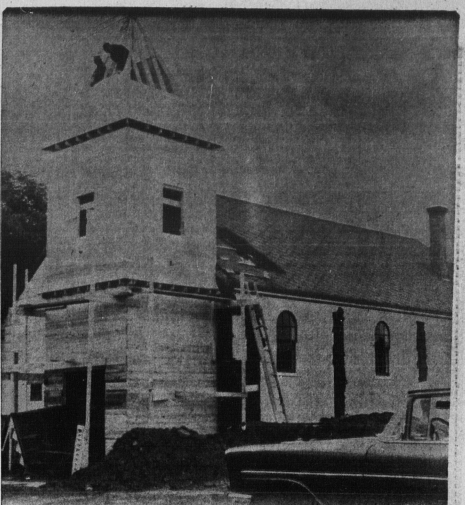
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Hockey Arena Being Converted
