## Witness Heard In Forgery Case

Following his electing trial by a judge and jury, one crown witness was heard in the case of Harold Arsenault, Charlottetown, by Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court yesterday.

Arsenault, who is counselled by John P. Nicholson, is charged with uttering a forged document, a Government of Canada cheque in the amount of \$169.65, payable to James A. Heron. The case for the prosecution is being conducted by Alan K. Scates.

The lone witness, James A. Heron, Charlottetown, identified a cheque produced by Mr. Scates as one issued by the Federal Income Tax Department, and made payable to the witness. DID NOT ENDORSE IT

He stated that he had never seen the cheque before, and that the endorsement "James A. Heron", written on the reverse side, had not been placed there by him.

Following the testimony of this witness, and due to the magistrate not wishing to proceed any further until the crown had provided a court stenographer, the accused was removed by consent until July 20.

Pleading guilty to being drunk

and disorderly, Frank Harley, Charlottetown, was remanded without bail until July 19. The testimony of the arresting police officer revealed that Harley had resisted arrest and after being placed in the police patrol he had kicked out a rear window and escaped into a back yard, where he was recaptured.

Charged with driving in the wrong direction on a one-way street, Dorchester, Pierce Trowdale, Mt. Allison, was given an adjournment until July 19.

INVOLVED IN COLLISION

Police information revealed that the accused had been involved in a collision at the intersection of Dorchester and Weymouth streets with another car, which was travelling south on Weymouth Street. Damage to the other vehicle was estimated at over \$100. Before he appears again, the magistrate ordered the accused to make some arrangements with the driver of the second car for the payment of damages.

Of three persons charged with being drunk and incapable, one was given 30 days in jail, which the magistrate suspended until noon, with the understanding that the accused intended to head out of the province by that time.

One other was given 30 days in Queens County Jail, and the third was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days.

For operating a motor vehicle without a driver's licence, another accused was fined \$5 and costs or two days in jail.

### NEW DOMINION UNITED CHURCH

#### New Dominion UC To Mark 100th Anniversary Sunday

A special centennial service will be conducted at the New Dominion United Church, Sunday to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the formation of the congregation.

The services will be conducted by Rev. I. L. Walls, Rev. John Ball and Rev. Dr. A. S. Weir. Special music for the service will be under the direction of the organist, Mrs. Arthur MacDonald.

The first "Meeting Place," as it was originally called was situated on the road leading from New Dominion to Long Creek and divine services of the Presbyterian faith were held there for a number of years. The congregation was widely scattered, extending from Rocky Point to Bonshaw on the south side of the river, as well as a large section on the north side of the Elliott River. At this time there was a ferry service at Westville.

The first church was situated in a rather isolated spot surrounded by woods on all sides. This and the need for land for a cemetery were the main reasons, presumed, for moving to the present site, part of the Wright estate.

Plans for the present structure were drawn up in 1863 by Charles Binns, Charlottetown lawyer and James MacGregor, architect and contractor.

The Act of Incorporation is dated April 17, 1862. The church became part of the United Church of Canada at the time of union, 1925.

#### Causeway Story Draws Comment

Commenting on a Canadian Press story in yesterday's *Guardian* which suggested that there are some anti-causeway rumblings in the province, Premier Walter Snow said "such a viewpoint has very little basis of support."

He said he had been in touch with the situation "ever since the causeway was promoted. While there have been a few pro and con discussions, I have yet to sense any recordable numbers of objections. There are always suppositions, but the people of Prince Edward Island, from an economic and social standpoint, feel the causeway will open a new era of prosperity and happiness for the province."

#### Death Occurs In Montreal

Sister St. Bernadette, CND, the former Mary Mullally of Souris River, died Wednesday, July 11, in hospital at Montreal after a long illness.

Sister St. Bernadette was on the teaching staff of St. Joseph's Convent, Charlottetown, for 33 years. She relinquished this position in October, 1961, because of illness and shortly after moved to Montreal.

She is survived by four brothers and three sisters—Rev. Finley Mullally, parish priest at Sturgeon; Sister St. Eitelbert, CND, Montreal; Howan, Souris River; Edward, New York City; Vernon, Dorchester, Mass.; Mrs. Margaret Higinbotham Sturgeon; and Mrs. Nellie Dunn.

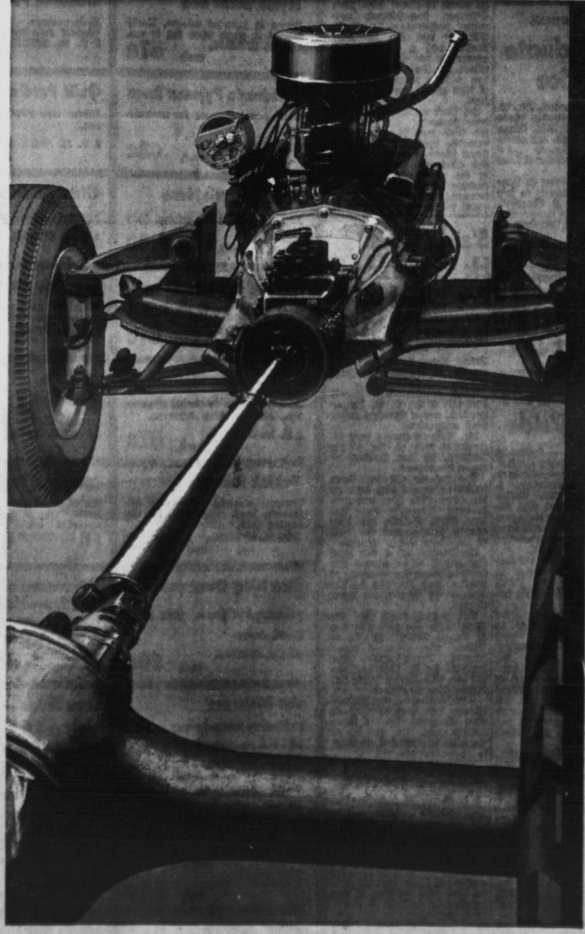
