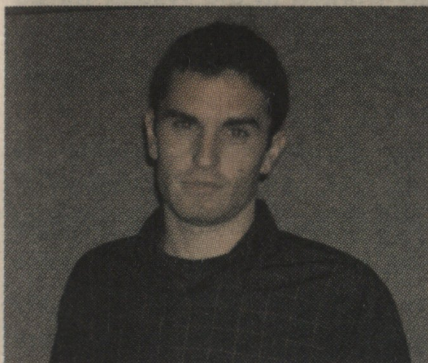

### Executive Reports
