Opening lead—three of clubs. To attack declarer in a suit where he is weak is a normal course for the defense to adopt but to attack declarer where he is presumably strong is rather rare, and can be justified only in exceptional circumstances. Excellent defensive reasoning was required of East in this deal to defeat the four heart contract. He won the opening club lead with the king. Had he led another club, declarer would have made the contract easily. After ruffing the club and drawing two rounds of trumps, South could then force out the A-K of diamonds and discard his three spade losers on the established diamonds.
