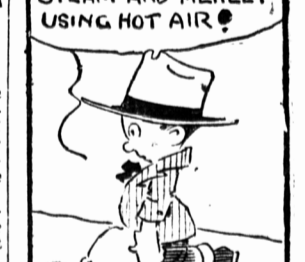

Husband And Wife Drowned In Ontario

Turn Down Demand
