Sidney Silodor, prominent Philadelphia editor, is a member of the six-man team which will represent the United States in the world championship match that starts this Saturday at Lake Como, Italy.

The Italian team, current holders of the world title, will represent Europe, having won the European championship in a 17-country tournament held in Vienna last summer.

An Argentine team which recently won the South American championship will also participate in the three-cornered contest to settle world bridge supremacy.

The American team consists of Silodor and John R. Crawford of Philadelphia, Alvin Roth of

Washington, D.C. and Tobias Stone, George Rapee and B. Jay Becker, all of New York.

Silodor was East in the hand shown when his opponents reached three no-trump in a tournament played some years ago. It was up to him to find the sensational defensive move that was required to defeat the game contract.

A diamond was opened and Silodor took the ace and fired back the king of spades. Declarer could not recover from this stroke. With one fell swoop, dummy's heart tricks were practically obliterated as the spade ace was forced out of dummy.

South wound up losing two diamonds and three clubs. With the more natural diamond return by Silodor, declarer would have had no trouble taking nine tricks.

Of course, the king of spades played gained declarer an extra spade trick. But the one-trick sacrifice took its intended toll.

Silodor reasoned that if South had the ace and another heart, there was no hope of defeating the contract. He therefore had to assume that declarer had the lone ace of hearts, or one or two small hearts.

In either case, dummy's ace of spades had to be attacked at once in order to neutralize the heart suit. If a spade trick were lost in the process, it would either defeat declarer or prove to be an inconsequential loss.

The hand was played in a team of four game. At the other table, four hearts was attempted and went down two tricks.

None of the 10 were named in Friday's report.

10 Employees Of Federal Gov't Have Been Fired

OTTAWA (CP) — Ten federal government employees have been fired since the June 10 election for political activities in the campaign the government reported Friday.

A statement tabled in the Commons at the request of George Hahn (SC — New Westminster) said seven of the 10 were dismissed on the complaint of Thomas Bell, parliamentary assistant for trade who represents St. John-Albert, that they had been political partisans in the campaign.

The seven were seasonal employees of the immigration branch at Saint John, N.B., dismissed last Dec. 6.

Calls Article On Mid-East Very Biased

WINDSOR, Ont. (CP) — Arthur Lourie, Israeli ambassador to Canada, tonight described an article by a University of Toronto professor dealing with the Middle East as "vicious" and "biased."

He said he could not recall any article "from a non-Arab pen, more biased, more distortive of the facts and more vicious in tendency than this article by Prof. Winnett."

The article, by Rev. I. V. Winnett, head of the Canadian Society of Oriental Languages at the University of Toronto, was published in the current issue of Maclean's magazine under the title "For the Sake of Argument."


Mr. Lourie said in an address to the Canadian Jewish Congress that the main conclusion of the article is that because of Israel's West is losing the Arab world and there can be neither peace nor stability in the area until the West withdraws its support of Israel.

"This judgment is as superficial as it is perilous to peace," The Arab League countries share a common hostility to Israel, said Mr. Lourie, ambassador in Ottawa since last fall. "But on almost every other subject they are deeply divided. It is of these divisions that the Soviet Union has taken adept advantage."

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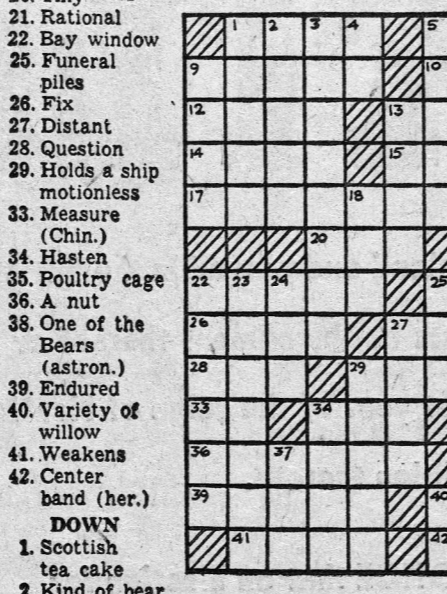
