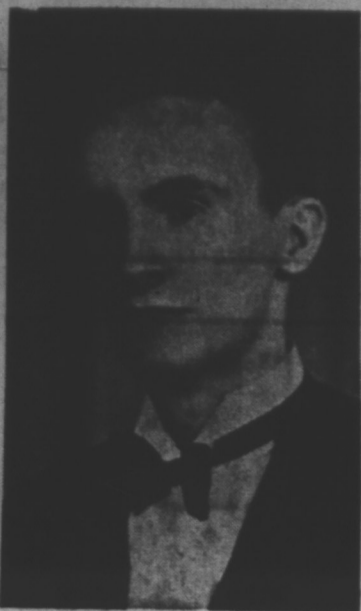

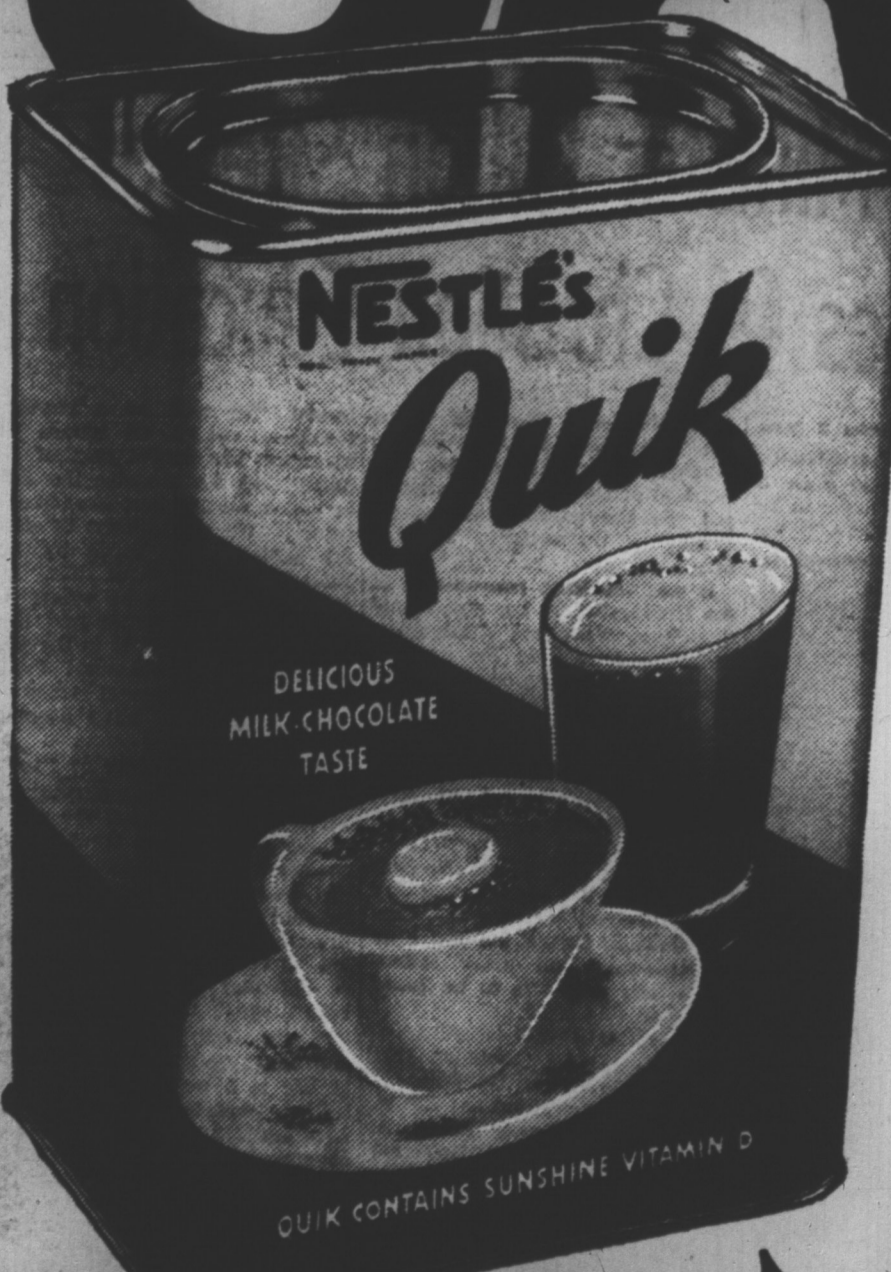
Mission Group Hears Speaker

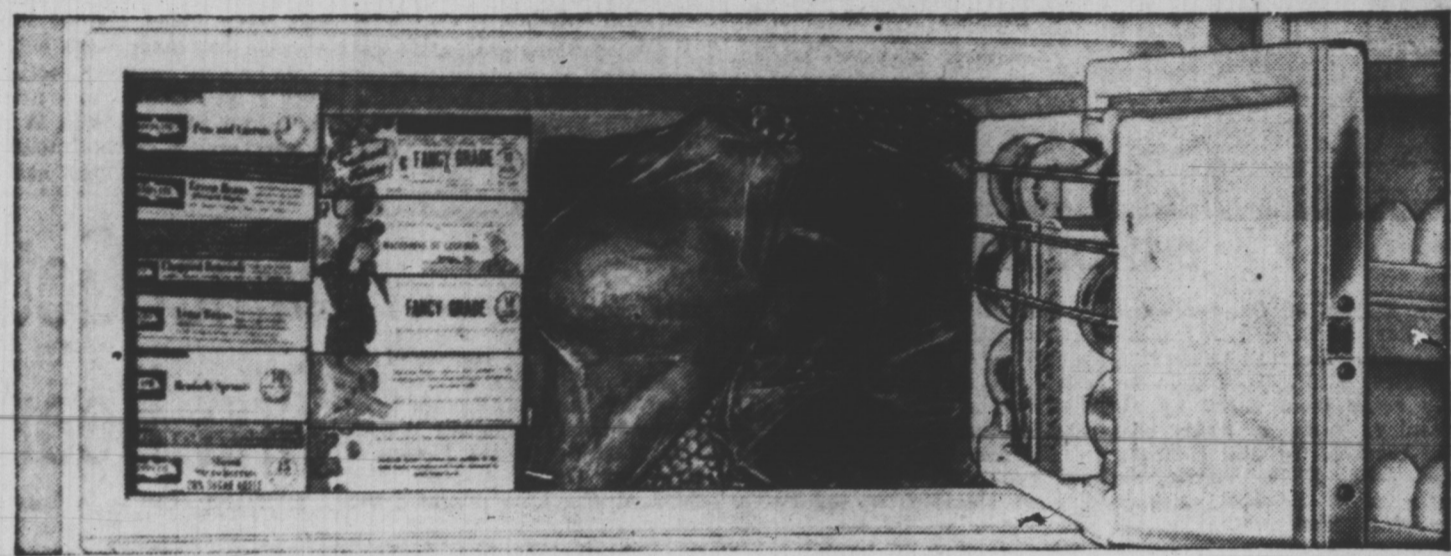
