WARNING AGAINST BLIGHT — Conditions are ideal for blight development in all of the areas covered by this service, states the weekly Potato Bulletin. Many growers have begun their blight control spray schedule and all others should start at once. Early applications are very important because the lower leaves can be covered with the fungicide before the plants fill in the rows. Colorado potato beetle larvae, aphids and tarnished plant bugs are present in many fields. DDT should be added to the regular sprays.

The market can be changed by weather conditions as they affect our late crop between now and harvest time; but irrespective of any possible change, the prospects look good for the coming year.

Primary Interest

"In spite of the propaganda that has been spread, the potato dealers of this Province are primarily interested in obtaining for the potato crop the highest price the market will pay; and it is recognized that the market is not controlled here but is controlled by Prince Edward Island, but is something that is continent-wide; and no matter what we would like to do, we are entirely limited to what we can get for potatoes by what the buyer is willing to pay us — and if we price ourselves out of line with other areas, he can always buy elsewhere.
