TAKE OVER FIRST

Cardinals Blank Milwaukee 2-0

MILWAUKEE (AP)—St. Louis Cardinals took over first place in the National League Monday by defeating Milwaukee Braves 2-0. They rallied for a run on three singles in the seventh and an unearned rally in the ninth after being shut out for 6 2/3 innings by lefty Warren Spahn.

The Cards slipped into first place ahead of the idle Brooklyn Dodgers, 667 to 636, but on the basis of games won and lost the clubs are tied. Milwaukee dropped from first to third in the day's only game in the majors.

Right-hander Tom Poholsky picked up his first victory of the season with an effective seven hitter.

Spahn pitched near perfect ball until the seventh when Kenny Boyer rifled a sharp single off Ed Matthews' glove at third. Rip Repuls kicked Wally Moon followed with singles, the later scoring Boyer.

Red Schoendienst scored in the ninth when he led off with a single off reliever Lou Sleazzer, went to second on a sacrifice, third on

a fielder's choice and home as Johnny Logan fumbled Joe Frazier's pinch grounder near second.

Another Reason For Marciano's Early Retirement

BOSTON (AP)—It wasn't sentiment alone that led Rocky Marciano to retire as heavyweight boxing champion—he apparently felt he was past his peak.

Rocky's trainer, Charley Goldman, who knows the 33-year old Brockton buster better than anyone in the game, told him so according to Boston Post columnist Gerry Hern Monday.

Hern, who found Marciano resting in his Catskill mountains retreat, reports Rocky's conversation:

"At the end, the training was getting tougher and tougher, but the fights were wonderful. You know, here's something I didn't tell anyone else."

"Late Friday afternoon (the day Rocky announced his retirement decision) I was talking with Charley Goldman, who taught me whatever boxing I know."

"You know what Charley told me?"

"He admitted that I was at my peak against (Archie) Moore. I might learn a couple more tricks and I had two or three more good fights left in me, but that was the peak."
