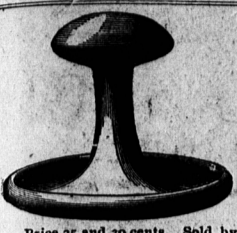

A CORRESPONDENT from the East writes The Guardian:—A snow storm reminds us that we haven't got spring yet, and as we now have some drift ice in our waters which will impart its chilling influences to the sea and the atmosphere, some snow and cold is probably yet in store for us.—The snow has covered the icy fields which were actually dangerous, and spoiled the tracks on Basin and Black Pond where our numerous horsemen, some of them hitherto unknown to fame, were exercising their trotters, and meeting in stern rivalry for the championship of the east. Lester Jarvis and Chester McNeill have arrived home from the lumber woods of Maine.—William McVein is confined to his house from the effects of a fall on the ice.

A CORRESPONDENT of The Guardian writes as follows:—A meeting was held in Wheatley River Hall on Saturday, Feb. 24th, to consider the advisability of agitating for improved railway facilities for the north side of the Island. Albert McKay was appointed chairman and T. D. Ling, secretary. The surrounding districts being well represented a lively discussion ensued. Stirring speeches were made by Robert Ware, Jas Power, Jas McDonald, Robt Buntain, J. L. Stevenson, T. D. Ling, J. W. Heseltine and others, after which it was unanimously decided that:—Whereas a loop line starting at or near Kensington, and passing through New London, Stanley, Cavendish, Rustico, Cove Head and Brackley Point and joining the main line at some point east, would benefit the entire north side better than three or four short spur lines which would be expensive to operate:—Therefore resolved that this meeting do put itself on record as being in favor of said route, and that another meeting be called for Thursday, March 1st, at 7.30 p. m. to further discuss the matter. And that the Secy be instructed to invite the committees from New Glasgow and Rustico to attend said meeting as well as residents from all the surrounding districts. The people of the north side being awake to the situation a large meeting is anticipated.

A Boston paper of Feb. 12, sent to The Guardian contains the following:—"Neil McQuarrie, 51, residing at 132 Linden ave, was found dead in an out building at the Wellington works of the Malden & Melrose Gas Co. late yesterday afternoon, by night watchman O'Brien who had just reported for duty. An autopsy was held on the body this morning by medical examiner Durrell of Somerville, assisted by medical examiner Swain of Cambridge and Dr. Chas. D. McCarthy of this city, who pronounced the cause of death as gas poisoning. The victim is a fireman and had been employed by the company about two weeks. He ran an engine there, to keep the water warm about the huge gasometer to prevent it from freezing. The body was found in the cellar of the building where there are many gates and shut-offs, and he is supposed to have met his death while at work there. The remains were taken in charge by the police and later turned over to a local undertaker. McQuarrie is a native of P. E. I. and has resided here only a few years. He was formerly employed by A. A. West and later by the Malden Coal Co. A widow survives him. No arrangements have yet been made for the funeral." Mr. McQuarrie was a native of Crapaud, and for some years lived in Charlottetown. He will be remembered by many Guardian readers. The death occurred on the 11th inst, and the funeral took place on the same day. The funeral of Neil McQuarrie of 132 Linden Ave who met his death Sunday of gas poisoning at the Wellington works of the local gas company, was held this afternoon at two o'clock at his late home. The services were conducted by Rev. Richard Eddy Sykes, pastor of the First Universalist church, and the burial was at Forestdale. Many relatives and friends attended the services, and there were many floral offerings. The casket was banked with beautiful flowers and many Islanders in Boston attended the funeral. 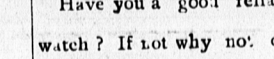
