

Olympics Close; Russia Is Tops

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (CP)—A turbulent 11th Winter Olympic Games, nursing burns from accidents, bicycles and lack of snow, came to a close Sunday with Europe sweeping the medals and silver and gold and a Canadian hockey team bitterly disappointed over a winless record.

Russia turned the 12-day games into one-country racing and won 38 medals, including the hockey championship, which might have been theirs. But it was the Russian women's seven gold medals that made such a lopsided Soviet show.

The Russians also won their third Olympic team championship, an unofficial one, in three days, this time scoring a total of 195 points—30 points more than in the 1950 Games. Norway and Sweden each won 18 points and Austria third with 17.

Canada had 24 points compared with 32 in 1950 and tied with Italy for ninth place among the 32 countries that competed here. Canada won the gold medal in the four-man bobsled and a pair of bronze medals in the pairs and women's figure skating.

PERFECT 7-0 RECORD
 Russia took the hockey title with a perfect 7-0 record after being pressed to the end by the Canadians, once the champions of them all.

The Canadians went home without a hockey medal for the first time in Olympic history, unseated out of gold record in the medal-winning second with Sweden and Czechoslovakia.

The Canadians were placed fourth under a mathematical formula that wasn't officially approved until 10 days before the tournament ended.

They were sure they had at least won a bronze medal and coach Rev. David Bauer and several players transferred down to the medal-awarding ceremonies to pick up their awards. But they were told they hadn't won anything.

Some 70,000 persons in the United States crowded the arena to witness the Berg left hill to finish the final event of the Games, a 100-meter bobsled jump.

Earl Ingvald, a 27-year-old sporting goods salesman from Trondheim, Norway, won the gold medal and the women's slalom of 307 and 287 feet for a total of 230.70 points.
