A LETTER from Capt. Joseph McDonald, of the brig "Reata," reports that while on the recent passage from Georgetown to Honfleur, France, in latitude 21, W., he lost one of the crew named Daniel Gillis, supposed to belong to Rollo Bay. Gillis was a carpenter, and worked at the building of the "Reata." He was swept over by the main-gaff, and was drowned before any assistance could be given.

THE "Golden Gate," the smallest craft that ever started for a trip around the world, left New York on Monday afternoon for Capetown. She is schooner rigged, 19 feet long, 2 1/2 feet depth of hold, and 1.17 ton burthen. Her crew, Captain H. F. Burrim and first officer Andrew B. Conn, are both experienced navigators, and are confident of making a safe voyage.

MISSIONARY MEETING.—The Rev. Mr. Christie, Presbyterian Missionary at Trinidad, will address a public meeting in St. James' Church on Thursday evening, at 8 o'clock, on the nature and results of the mission work in that interesting field. The meeting will also be addressed by the Rev. Dr. Murray. A collection will be taken up in aid of the mission. The public are cordially invited to attend.

In working their lime quartz, the Albert, N. B., Brick Lime Cement Company have opened a vein of phosphate of lime, which promises to be of great importance to the agricultural and commercial interests of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and P. E. Island. This valuable fertilizer is just what is needed to restore exhausted lands to their original productiveness, and keep our farming population at home.

LAST NIGHT the police raided another house of ill-fame. It was kept by Mrs. Ellen Blackburn, and is situated on Kent Street. Mrs. Blackburn was arrested in company with a respectable looking young man—a stranger in the city. He gave forty dollars as bail for his appearance before the Stipendiary Magistrate this forenoon, but left for parts unknown during the night. This morning Mrs. B. was arraigned. Her twelve years' old daughter gave evidence against her; and, on this evidence, she was convicted of keeping a brothel, and sentenced to three months imprisonment, with hard labor. The sum of money left by the frequenter of this brothel was ordered to be forfeited to the city.
