# CONTRACT BRIDGE

Albert Benjamin, writing in the (British) Bridge Magazine, relates some of his experience with a little man he keeps running into.

He likes the man all right, except for his one bad habit. It seems that the little man shows Benjamin a hand, asks what he would bid, waits for the answer, and then disappears. Benjamin never learns whether the answer is right or wrong.

For example, the little man asks Benjamin what he would do as South, if West opened two clubs, North passed, East bid two spades, and South had:

♠ K J 7 4 ♥ 8 3 ♦ A K Q 10 9 5 2

Benjamin replies that there is some doubt whether it is better to preempt in diamonds, or whether it is better to pass and hope that North will lead a club against a high heart contract West might reach.

Of course, the little man disappears after posing the question. Six months later Benjamin meets the man again and asks what happened on the hand. The little man doesn't remember what happened. He doesn't even remember the hand.

Not only that, but the little man poses still another problem. South is playing in six spades doubled. West leads the three of hearts, and it wins the trick! The defense is sound and South makes the contract. What are the four hands?

Benjamin spends some sleepless nights trying to construct a hand to meet the conditions stated by the little man. Finally he comes up with a hand that makes sense, but he can't locate the little man to find out whether he's right. Here is the hand Benjamin composes:

East dealer.  
 East-West vulnerable.

**NORTH**  
 ♠ A 10 5 3  
 ♥ A 2  
 ♦ 10 9 8 7 6 5  
 ♣ 2

**WEST**  
 ♠ K Q J 10 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2  
 ♥ A 2  
 ♦ A K Q 10 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2

**SOUTH**

The bidding:  
 East South West North  
 2♣ 2♣ 4♥ 4♠  
 5♣ Pass 5♥ 5♠  
 6♣ Pass 6♥ 6♠  
 Double

Opening lead—three of hearts. Declarer ducks the heart. East discards a club, and South thereupon discards the jack of diamonds. A heart is continued and South discards the king of diamonds on the ace of hearts. Declarer then cashes the K-A of spades, leads diamonds twice through the A-Q, later discards four clubs on the established diamonds, and thus makes the slam!

## 19th Sleeping Sickness Case Is Suspected

EDMONTON (CP)—A 19th suspected human case of sleeping sickness in Alberta was reported here but it was the first since the weekend and health officials believe the outbreak is nearly over.

The new victim is from Fort Kent, near St. Paul, St. Paul, 100 miles northeast of Edmonton, has been the centre of an outbreak of sleeping sickness among horses.

Dr. E. S. O. Smith, provincial director of local health units, said he has not received confirmation of any of the human cases.

The disease is suspected in the death of two men in Medicine Hat and a youth in the Hazelmere district 275 miles northwest of Edmonton. Dr. Smith said it will be "some time" before the cause of death is established in the cases.
