Montague Council Renews
Can. Federation Membership

MONTAGUE — A special meeting of the Montague Town Council was held last evening for the purpose of appointing assessors for 1963, and to deal with the matter of renewing membership in the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities.

As Town Clerk G. Arnold Wightman was unable to be present Stewart Vickers was appointed clerk for the meeting. All councillors were present. Also present was police officer Edward Dowse.

George Gordon and Athol Robertson were appointed assessors for the 1963 tax year and will begin immediately.

Montague has been a member of the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities for several years and until recently was the only small town in the province to be a member.

Mayor Yeo has attended federation meetings in 1958 at Montreal, 1959 at North Bay, 1960 Chicago and 1961 in Halifax.

At the North Bay convention he gave notice of resolution for assistance for small towns and municipalities and again presented it at Chicago and had it adopted and also had it adopted at Halifax, with results pending.

At last evening's meeting he advised that either the town should belong to the provincial organization and the C.A.M. along with the other small towns, all together or all get out of it. He thought Albertson and Borden now were members of both and if all worked together they might get somewhere.

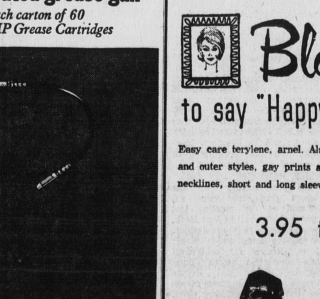

Needles in Sky Experiment Will Be Revived By USAF

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—was supposed to provide a lamp proof method of global radio communication. That experiment failed when the mechanism that was to release the tiny copper dipoles failed to function. Instead of scattering they remained in a mass.

At that time various scientists including Sir Bernard Lovell, director of the huge radio telescope at Jodrell Bank, England, the entire mass will weigh only 50 pounds.

Lincoln Laboratory scientists said the initial "release" of metallic hairs from the satellite is expected to lengthen about 1,200 miles a day and that after a month both ends will join around the world and droplets will intermerge.

Military interest in the project arises from the fact that such an orbiting band might provide a reliable means of communication not dependent upon satellites which could be destroyed by enemy action.
