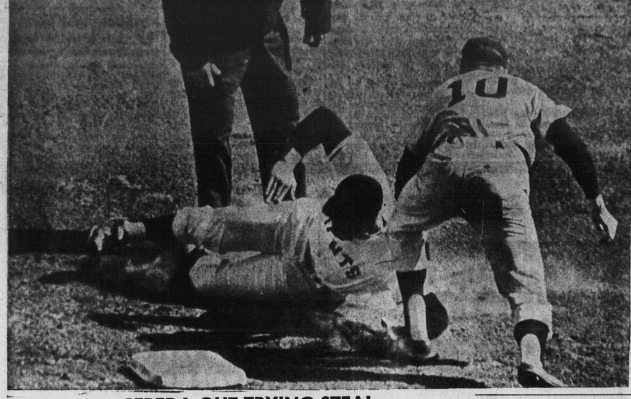

Gold Wedding Comes Up As Joint Favorite Today

LONDON (CP) — Gold Wedding, backed by thousands of hunch bets, emerged as joint favorite Tuesday night in the final call-over for today's Cambridgebridge Stakes. Last major race of the British season.

Golden Wedding was quoted at 11 to 1, along with Hidden Meaning, previously top favorite at 10 to 1 in Monday night's call-over. The late Hurry on Golden Wedding was apparently based on the similarity of its name to Golden Fire, winner of the autumn double.

At Monday night's call-over Golden Wedding in was third choice at 14 to 1, but advanced rapidly in the last day of pre-race betting. Bewildroom received second choice at 12 to 1 in the final call-over.

Third choice was Color Blind at 16 to 1, advancing from 18 to 1 on word that jockey Lester Pigott, who usually rides to the big occasion, is at the top of his form.

Hidden Meaning will be ridden by Australian jockey Scottie Broadie, who topped Pigott by seven victories to become champion jockey last season. However, Hidden Meaning has never won over the mile distance, and the Cambridgebridge is a 1 1/4-mile event.

LONDON (AP) — Brian Curvis, British and Empire welterweight boxing champion, Tuesday night narrowly outpointed Cuy Sumlin, of Mobile, Ala., in a 10-rounder that brought a mixture of boss and cheers from the crowd of 14,000.
