MONTREAL (CP) - The U.S. dollar closed Monday at a discount of 2 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 1-1/2. Pound Sterling \$2.72 5-8 unchanged.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market eased lower Monday in light trading. It was the first definite trend the market had set in a week but brokers considered the lower picture as only temporary.

They said the market would probably remain indefinite and uninteresting the rest of the week while the Republican political convention is in progress at San Francisco. Last week the exchange went through five listless sessions and brokers blamed the Democratic convention at Chicago for the effect.

Senior base metals were lower with International Nickel and Labrador off 1 1/2 points, Hudson Bay lost a point. Fractional losers were Falconbridge, Consolidated Smelters, Steep Rock and Quomet.

Coppers were stronger with Campbell Colibugamau ahead 1/2. Other copper issues added minor gains. Iron Ore lost 20 cents in junior base metals but Belcher and Arcadia Nickel were up 10 cents.

Creo Oil featured western oils gaining 40 cents. Gridoil, however, lost 1 1/2 points and Husky 1/2. Canadian Southern Petroleum and National Petroleum were off 15 cents.
