In the case of Crosskill against the Halifax Herald for damages, a verdict was given for plaintiff, the damages being assessed at \$3,000.

The appointment of the Marquis of Ripon as Viceroy of India is received favorably; much disappointment, however, is felt that Lord Dufferin's health prevented his appointment.

Sir John Macdonald stated the other night that over 7,000 immigrants had gone into the Northwest this spring, a very satisfactory commentary upon the calculations made in the lands and Pacific Railway debates.

Major General Luard will not take command of the Canadian militia until 1st July, and Lieut. General Sir Selby Smyth will remain in the Dominion until about the middle of June. He will be in command at the Quebec review on the 24th May.

Arrangements are progressing for a general meeting of Home Rulers in Dublin, before the reassembling of Parliament, on the 20th, to decide upon the merits of fixity of tenure and peasant proprietary, in view of a scheme of land reform to be submitted to the Government.

The New York Life Insurance Company paid over to the executors of the late Bernard Devlin, M. P., of Montreal on the 4th \$22,000, the amount of insurance on the life of deceased. This was almost the only provision which Mr. Devlin had made for his three children.

The rate of wages for laborers and mechanics is advancing in Montreal. Day laborers got \$1 per day at the present, against 60c. last year. Carpenters, compositors, bakers, shoemakers and members of other trades are receiving from 10 to 25 per cent increase over last year's rates.

PRINCE LEOPOLD'S VISIT.—Prince Leopold leaves England on May 13th, accompanied by the Hon. Alec York and Dr. Rhyll. He will first visit his sister at Ottawa, then follow a route including St. Louis, Chicago, Cincinnati, Washington, New York, and Newport. He will, in all, spend four months in America.

THE CANADA TEMPERANCE ACT.—Mr. Boulbee's amendment to the Canada Temperance Act, making a majority of the whole number of electors on the register necessary to bring the Act into operation in any county, has been carried in the Commons. It is believed by Temperance men that this amendment will virtually kill the act.

A terrible tragedy is reported from Penn Van, New York. Mrs. George Woodruff, during the temporary absence of her husband from home, took her two sleeping children from the bed, one aged 6, the other 1 year old, and going to the cistern drowned both. Her husband soon returning found them in the cistern. The mother was standing up with the infant in her arms, it being dead. The other child was in the water which was about to the woman's waist. The woman undoubtedly is insane.

A sensational report is current of the intention of James Gordon Bennett to establish a chain of two-cent morning newspapers from New York to the Pacific coast, and including such cities as Buffalo, Cincinnati, St. Louis, Chicago, Kansas City and San Francisco. It is understood that Mr. John R. Young, who is to have the general management of the journalistic belt, was lately in Cincinnati for the purpose of making arrangements, and that he is now in the West engaged in preparing for the early inception of the large enterprise. The papers will, it is said, be backed by Mr. Bennett's capital, will share in the Herald's telegraphic system and facilities, and will be, like the Herald, independent as to politics.
