

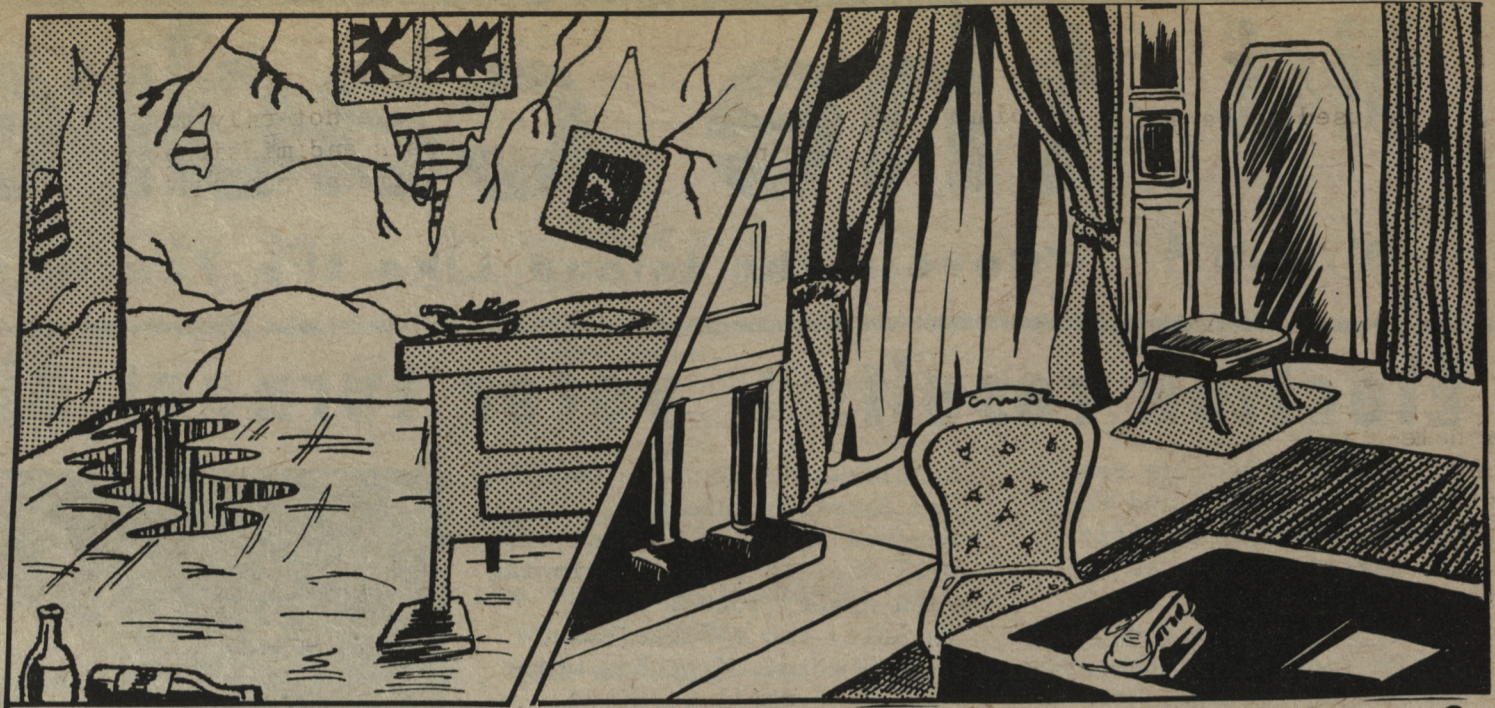
# editorial
