Queen contest will be feature

The Queen of the Furrows contest will again be an interesting feature of the annual Plowing match and agricultural fair. Caroline Campbell was the 1965 Queen when the contest was initiated as a colorful part of the 25th Anniversary prize meet. Three young ladies had been sponsored as entries late last week for this year's competition. George MacDonald of St. George's is the chairman of this colorful phase of the big two-day meet, and he is putting his energy and initiative into the effort to make the event a success.

Late last week entries included Ethel McLean, St. George's; Doris Hunter, Strathcona and Jean MacKay, also of Strathcona.

The crowning of the Queen will be given the top-flight attention the event merits, and the announcement of the winner and the actual crowning will be done on the speakers' platform, immediately prior to the official opening ceremonies.

The time is 1.30 Wednesday afternoon, and the person placing the crown on the new Queen's head will be Miss Campbell who won the honor a year ago.

Co-operative Apartment Is Symbol

NEW YORK (AP)—The newest symbol of elegance and wealth—comes in a 25-story package called 980 Fifth Ave. "Nine-Eighty" to its friends. The building is opposite Central Park and near the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

It is a co-operative apartment building in which 44 apartments range in cost from \$80,300 to \$118,000. They are believed to be among the most expensive apartments in the world.

In a co-operative setup, apartments are purchased outright by tenants who become their own landlords and elect a board of governors to run the building for them.

For the time being, Nine-Eighty is little more than a forest of steel girders sticking out of a hill of brick. But when it's finished, Nine-Eighty will be heaven's gift to the rich.

Every one of the apartments has bathroom fixtures plated with 18-karat gold. Bathroom floors, tubs and sinks are marble.

EVEN DUST KEPT OUT

Each apartment has two air conditioning systems, one that permits heating of some rooms and cooling of others simultaneously, and a second that circulates fresh air after it has been filtered to remove humidity, dust and pollen.

In most cases, there are two apartments to one floor, except in the case where there are two floors to one apartment. That one sells for \$118,000.

But that apartment—15 rooms, 14 baths and an assortment of dressing rooms—already has been sold to Stephen Currier, a member of the Mellon family which owns an assortment of banks and substantial stock in the Gulf Oil Corp.

Pope Paul Notes Unease, By Priests

CASTEL GANDOLFO, Italy (Reuters)—Pope Paul said here a wave of doubt, unease and disquiet has affected many Roman Catholic priests since the recent Vatican ecumenical council.

He said it is necessary to prevent the ferment of ideas and novelties brought by the council from leading to an arbitrary instability of thought and lack of cohesion inside the church.

Speaking to a group of Italian priests in an audience at his summer residence here, the Pope said:

"It seems to us most important that the spirit of our church should find again its lucidity and its balance. 'Nobody is unaware that a wave of doubt, unease, and disquiet has poured into the souls of many priests, often giving rise to a most varied, complex and disordered set of problems, which easily repudiates most respected habits of piety and ecclesiastical custom, till yesterday held deservedly in honor.'"

Vatican observers noted that it was the second time this week he has upbraided a section of the church—which he has not identified—for a loss of faith and a greater worldliness.

Wednesday, he told a general audience that some people in the Roman Catholic Church are casting doubts about the eternal truths of the faith. Some perhaps have the desire of opening up toward the non-Roman Catholic world, he said.

Life Term Is Imposed

KITCHENER, Ont. (CP)—Henry Joseph Dietrich, 44, has been sentenced to life imprisonment when he pleaded guilty to a reduced charge of non-capital murder in the shooting of Kitchener taxi driver Elmer Battler, July 13, 1945.

Mr. Justice W. A. Donohue accepted the plea after Crown Attorney Harold Daufman, said he believed that under the circumstances the net results would be the same as a capital-murder conviction.

Regardless of the outcome he saw little likelihood that capital punishment would be enforced. Dietrich was arrested at London, Ont., last November after he said he had committed a murder 20 years ago and wanted to confess. An inquest into Battler's death in 1945 had resulted in a verdict of accidental death.

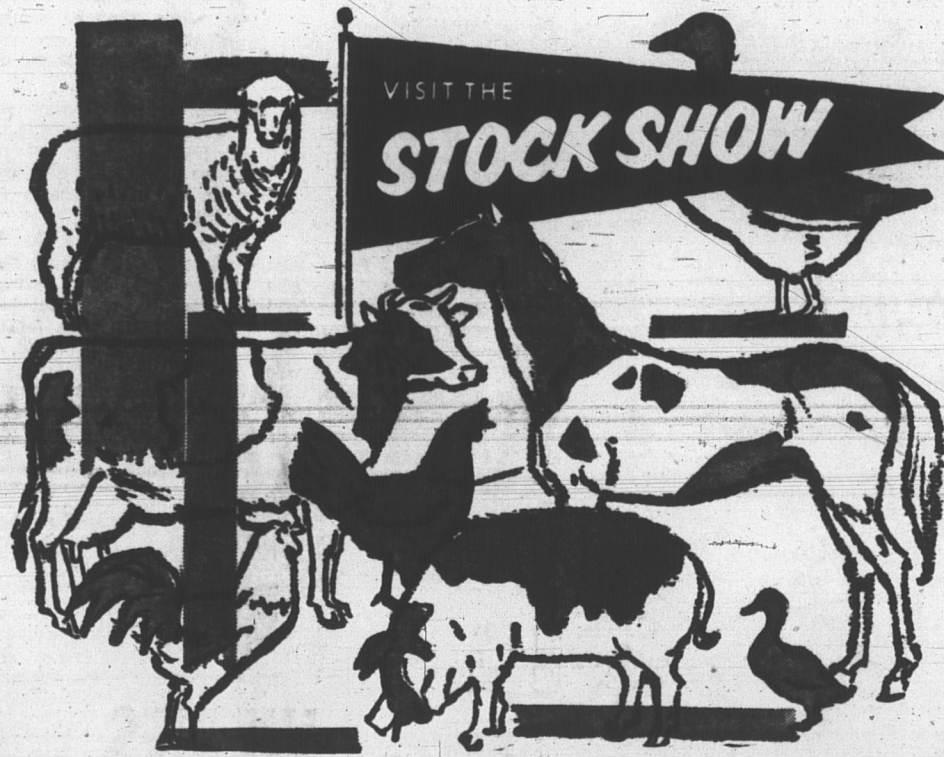
