But if the suit is divided 4-1, it is important that the first low diamond lead come from dummy, just in case East has the singleton queen. Four diamond tricks can be made if this is the case. If West has the singleton queen, the contract is hopeless. Accordingly, upon a winning lead, South leads a club to the ace, plays a low diamond, with the queen with the king, catches the jack, and then takes a proven finesse against the ten.

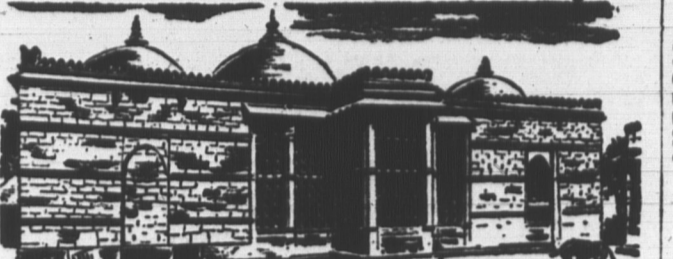

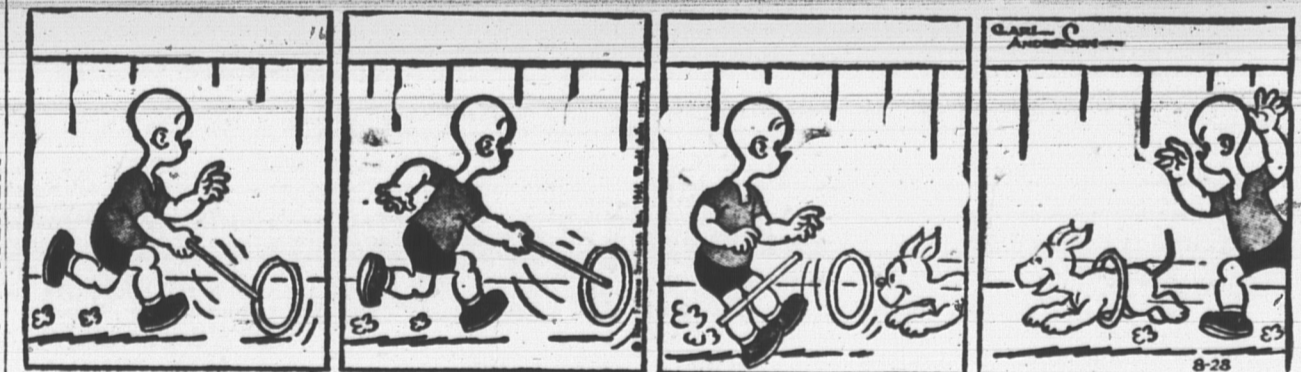
