ALLERGY MAY INTERFERE WITH NORMAL GROWTH IN CHILDREN

Parents and family physicians know from experience that some children seem to catch everything in the way of children's diseases—head fever, hives, stomach upsets, head colds and other ailments.

In The Journal of Pediatrics (children's diseases) Dr. J. B. Welsh reports his study of 34 allergic children, ranging in age from 18 months to 1 1/2 years, for periods of 12 to 100 months.

The above information should cause parents to remember that when their youngster is not growing at the normal rate while infected teeth, tonsils, or other infection can be a cause, tests for allergy should be made as this may be the underlying cause of retardation of growth.
